Chairman Bunten distributed a Summary of Expenditures Necessary to Implement the State Water Plan prepared by the Kansas Water Office (Attachment_1).

Michael O'Keefe, Director of the Budget, presented an overview of the Natural Resources initiatives in the Governor's budget for FY 1989 and FY 1990. He noted that all of the initiatives recommended by the Governor are not in the State Water Plan. Approximately 54 percent of the Natural Resources initiatives for FY 1990 are funded from the State General Fund. Approximately 32 percent is from the Economic Development Initiatives Fund (EDIF).

Three Natural Resources initiatives not included in the State Water Plan are the Recreational Access Program, Cooperative Habitat Districts and Land Acquisition. Under the Recreational Access Program funded at \$1.2 million from the EDIF, landowners will submit bids and the state will lease those accepted and issue permits for hunting on the land.

Mr. O'Keefe stated the Governor's budget recommends that the Legislature identify permanent funding of \$6.2 million for Natural Resources initiatives aimed at prevention of water contamination and management of wastes. Chairman Bunten announced that tomorrow the Water Authority will appear before the Committee to discuss the various Water Plan initiatives.

Regarding the new hospital reimbursement system proposed by the Governor, Mr. O'Keefe explained that currently the state reimburses hospitals on the basis of cost per day, regardless of the procedure performed, calculated for each individual hospital in the state. SRS worked with the hospitals to arrive at a system based on diagnosis-related groups (DRG). The DRG system will reimburse hospitals for the cost of performing a specific operation or service and address the problem of rural and urban hospitals. Kansas has three hospital groupings: (1) 200 beds or more and all hospitals within ten miles of these hospitals; (2) 100-199 beds and those within ten miles; and (3) under 100 beds. There are 15-18 hospitals in the first grouping. The cost of implementing this system is approximately \$9.8 million. The total request for FY 1990 is \$101 million.

The change to this system may be done administratively through rules and regulations. In response to a question, Mr. O'Keefe stated SRS has not considered using this system for reimbursing doctors. Chairman Bunten asked if this proposed appropriation anticipates we will not need a supplemental next year for medical
