MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON ENERGY AND NATURAL RESOURCES

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Dennis Spaniol.

House Bill 2247 - Radioactive waste, shipment, notice, requirements.

Representative McClure proposed the following amendments: On line 22, to strike the words "by-product material"; on line 24 before the word "prior", to add "5 days". Representative McClure, seconded by Representative Freeman, moved to adopt the amendments. The motion passed. A motion was made by Representative McClure, seconded by Representative Lucas to pass House Bill 2247 favorably as amended. The motion carried.

House Bill 2303 - Crossbow hunting authorized for handicapped persons.

Representative Freeman offered the following amendments: On line 21, before the word "bow" add "compound". On line 31, add new subsection "(c) The secretary of wildlife and parks may adopt rules and regulations for the approval of application for permits authorized under subsection (a)." Add new subsection "(d) Any person who falsely obtains or uses a permit under subsection (a) shall constitute a Class E misdemeanor." A motion was made by Representative Freeman, seconded by Representative Patrick to adopt the amendments. The motion passed. Representative Patrick, seconded by Representative Lucas, moved to report House Bill 2303 favorably as amended. The motion carried.

House Bill 2341 - Commercial fossil hunters regulation.

A motion was made by Representative Patrick, seconded by Representative Mollenkamp to recommend House Bill 2341 favorably for passage. The motion passed.

House Bill 2351 - Conservation easements for preservation of historical and other property.

Representative Freeman moved that the new language in lines 69 through 74 be stricken. Representative Fry seconded and the motion passed. Representative Freeman, seconded by Representative Lucas, moved that House Bill 2351 as amended be reported favorably for passage. The motion carried.

A question was asked about House Bill 2367, the recreational access bill. Chairman Spaniol said that at the request of the Secretary of Wildlife and Parks, this bill would be sent to an exempt committee to be kept alive.

The Chairman also advised that House Bill 2363, prohibiting location of landfill near navigable stream or water intake station, also would be sent to an exempt committee.

The meeting was adjourned.
