The meeting of the House Governmental Organization Committee was called to order by Representative Thomas F. Walker, Chairman. He stated the minutes would stand approved at the end of the meeting if there were no corrections or additions. He called attention to the Revised Agenda for next week. The deadline for getting Senate Bills out of Committee is a week from Tuesday, March 28.

Review of Administrative Services - SRS

Chairman Walker prefaced his introduction of Commissioner Duncan by telling the Committee that the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services is so big it cannot be looked at in one session. The Committee is taking one Commission at a time, starting with Administrative Services. The Commissioner, J. Santford "Sandy" Duncan, served in the Kansas Legislature for several years prior to his present position.

Commissioner Duncan thanked the Chairman and began his presentation. He brought a chart detailing the seven divisions of Administrative Services. He stated that each Senior Manager of the respective divisions would make a 2-3 minute summary of his/her area.

The Senior Managers of the Seven Divisions are: Herman Havenstein, General Services; Gary Wiedenbock, Facilities Management; Rick Reseda, Information Resources; Jim Robertson, Child Enforcement; Cheryl Webber, CAECES; Ann Aylsbury, Planning and Research; Arthur McKesh, Design and Publication. Also introduced were Chris Standiferd, Budget Director and Diane Kastner, Facilities Management.

Each individual gave a brief summary and answered questions put to them by the Committee.

Chairman Walker thanked Commissioner Duncan and his staff and adjourned the meeting.
