CONSIDERATION OF BILLLS

S.B. 11 - Municipal courts, recordkeeping requirements, Re: Proposal No. 23

A motion was made by Representative Solbach and seconded by Representative Jenkins to report S.B. 11 favorably for passage. The motion passed.

S.B. 79 - Expungement of certain convictions or records not permitted.

Representative Snowbarger moved to report S.B. 79 favorably for passage. The motion was seconded by Representative Jenkins. The motion passed.

The Committee discussed circumstances where an expungement of a conviction for an attempted sex crime against young people should be considered. It was also discussed that victims would be notified and would have an opportunity to have input at an expungement hearing. This was included in H.B. 2200.

A vote was taken on the motion, and the motion passed.

S.B. 8 - Commitment of persons found not guilty by reason of insanity, Re: Proposal No. 21

Representative Snowbarger moved and Representative Jenkins seconded to report S.B. 8 favorably for passage. The motion passed.

A motion was made by Representative Walker and seconded by Representative Jenkins to approve the minutes of February 28, March 1, March 2 and March 3, 1989. The motion passed.
