Conferees appearing before the committee:

Representative Adam wished to make changes on the minutes of January 24, 25, 26, 30, and February 7 meetings. The changes were extensive. Members will need time to read them. Approval of minutes moved to a later date.

Sub-committee maps were due Tuesday, but they still are not ready today. Apparently, there is only one area of the state where agreement has been reached. Therefore, since maps still must be drawn, today's presentation is based on materials which Research has in the computer at this time and revisions will be made from this material.

Research prepared informational material entitled "Committee No. 1" (Attachment 1). Mary Galligan, Research explained that it is a summary of the numbers on the map at this time. Maps being presented of the areas where there have not been agreements are those put together by the Republican sub-committee members.

Representative Reardon presented the only sub-committee map on which agreement has been reached, explaining the rationale for district lines. Old District 33 had to be collapsed. They strove to maintain compactness, as well as contiguity; carefully considered minority makeup especially in Districts 34 and 35 and in general followed the "Guidelines" in drawing the district lines for Wyandotte County. The local Kansas City Kansan newspaper editorially endorsed this map as being fair to all interests. Handouts included "House Deviation Report, County: Wyandotte" (Attachment 2), and "Wyandotte County district map" (Attachment 3). This sub-committee report will be incorporated into the Committee map.

Representative Shore reported that earlier today he had been presented with a new map for the West-Southwest portion of the state. That new map divides 14 counties rather than seven as originally presented by this sub-committee. They will continue to work on the maps.

Representative Roe reported on the problems in Central Kansas caused by the shortage of people. This makes it quite difficult to form "compact" districts. They tried to preserve "communities of interest" as much as possible. These maps have been a matter of public knowledge for at least 30 days, because mail has been received on the proposed districts. Because of the central location there are several cross-hatched areas which still have to be worked out.

Representative Miller reported on the Northeast's loss of population and impact of other areas impinging on the Northeast, especially Shawnee, Johnson, and Wyandotte counties. Representative Miller also presented a proposed Shawnee County map, showing collapsed districts.

Chairman Snowbarger advised that Johnson County picks up four new seats. The new districts are numbered 14, 15, 16, and 17. Started off in the NE corner, trying to solidify cities, to get deviations higher here, to allow for growth in southern and western areas. Precinct 5-14 in Overland Park presented a major problem. It has over 4,500 people and is on the edge of five different districts.

Representative Freeman stated that Southeast Kansas has a population loss of 23,733 people. This works out to slightly more than one seat. They tried to leave current districts as much intact as possible and combined communities of interest in rural areas in Crawford and Cherokee counties to make up the numbers from the collapsed district. They need to work with Representative Miller on the border between Northeast and Southeast.

Representative Grotewiel reported that he and Representative Williams drew the Sedgwick County map. There are two big growth areas in Wichita, one on the east side next to the Butler County line. The other is on the west side (District 94) and had twice the number of people it should have, so the western part was split. Another smaller growth area was in the south part of Wichita. This is the most problematic. Worked to maintain guidelines and criteria. They came within the deviations for all 20 seats except for District 95 which is very large and cannot be switched with other districts. The numbers are 30-40 over the higher deviation. Did not change the nature of District 89 which is very much a minority district. District 84's minority characteristics essentially are not changed, even though there are all new precincts. They made every effort not to dilute minority voting strength.

Representative King addressed the problems in the metro area that go across county lines. The Wichita metro area crosses county lines. The Andover area is as fast a growing area as Wichita proper. Very large precincts in and surrounding Andover and Pleasanton. Butler county is now split five ways and practically any other proposed plan will probably continue this split. Representative King briefly outlined some possibilities for dealing with this area.

The Committee will meet again tomorrow, March 31, 1989. Sub-committee should continue meeting to work out differences.

Meeting adjourned at 1:40.

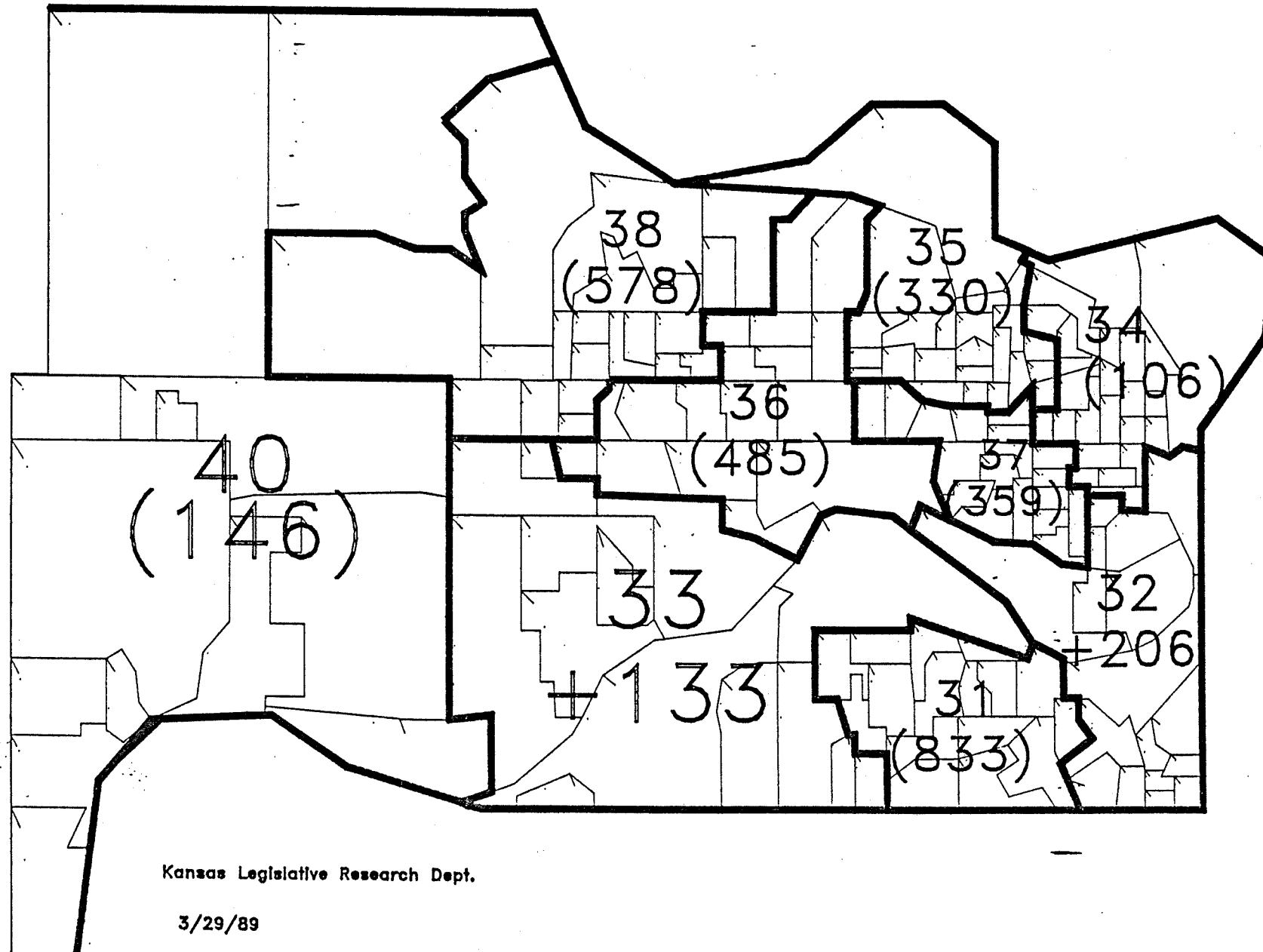
