MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

The meeting was called to order by SENATOR JOSEPH C. HARDER at

Conferees appearing before the committee:

Following a call to order, Chairman Joseph C. Harder referred the Committee's attention to SB 352, a bill prohibiting boards of education on or after July 1, 1989 from entering into any contract for the lease-purchase of a permanent structure for a school building. Senator Karr moved that SB 352 remain in Committee and be recommended for study by an interim committee. Senator Frahm seconded the motion.

Senator Parrish made a substitute conceptual motion to amend SB 352 whereby school boards would be eligible to enter into lease-purchase contracts subject to a protest petition. Senator Karr seconded the substitute motion, but the substitute motion was rejected.

When the Chairman referred the Committee's attention to the original motion to recommend SB 352 for study by an interim committee, the motion carried.

When the Chairman asked the Committee's pleasure regarding HB 2203, relating to General Fund transfers by school districts, Senator Karr moved, and Senator Allen seconded the motion to recommend HB 2203 favorably for passage. The motion carried.

When the Chairman asked the Committee's pleasure regarding HB 2201, pertaining to school district competitive bidding requirements, Senator Parrish moved, and Senator Frahm seconded the motion to recommend HB 2201 favorably for passage. The motion carried.

In response to the Chairman's call for action, Senator Parrish moved that HB 2267, relating to enforcement of the compulsory school attendance law, be recommended favorably for passage. Senator Langworthy seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

When the Chairman referred the Committee's attention to HB 2218, a bill authorizing development and implementation of parent education programs, Senator Parrish moved to report HB 2218 favorably for passage. Senator Langworthy seconded the motion. When the Chairman announced that the motion had failed, a request for a division (five yeas and six nays) confirmed the Chairman's original ruling that the motion had been rejected.

Senator Allen moved, and Senator Karr seconded the motion to approve minutes of the Committee meeting of March 22. The motion carried.

The Chair adjourned the meeting.
