Chairman Reilly called the meeting to order.

A continued hearing was held on SB 77 which deals with mandatory life imprisonment for certain crimes.

Attorney General Stephan appeared to endorse this bill and said he was pleased to see felony murder was included. He believes that if a person is convicted of first degree murder with aggravating circumstances, a minimum of 40 years should be served before parole is considered.

After committee discussion, Chairman Reilly announced that the bill will be worked at a later date.

Committee members were asked to consider a clean-up proposal dealing with food requirements in drinking establishments. Senator Bond made a conceptual motion to correct the inconsistency with food requirement percentages for multiple ownership establishments. Senator Yost seconded and the motion carried.

Senator Vidricksen moved the committee introduce the proposal on regulations for firearms. Senator Ehrlich seconded and the motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:53.
