MINUTES OF THE Senate COMMITTEE ON Federal & State Affairs

The meeting was called to order by Senator Edward F. Reilly at

Chairman Reilly called the meeting to order.

Senator Morris moved the minutes of March 6 be approved. Senator Strick seconded and the motion carried.

Mark Wettig appeared before the committee to request introduction of a bill which would allow the Division of Vehicles to obtain the social security number of taxpayers from state tax records. Senator Morris moved the introduction and Senator Vidricksen seconded. The motion passed.

Senator Daniels requested introduction of a bill which would establish a Commission on Epilepsy. Senator Bond moved the introduction and Senator Strick seconded. The motion passed.

Senator Daniels moved that the waiting period for driver's license privileges after a seizure be changed from 1 year to 6 months. Senator Strick seconded and the motion carried.

Discussion was held on SB 200 which deals with the use of parimutuel proceeds by local governments.

Senator Strick requested an amendment which would allow cities or counties with a federally mandated facility that costs the taxpayers more than 10 mills, to use a portion of the money generated to the "not for profit" entity, to be contributed to that qualifying city or county. Senator Strick moved the amendment and Senator Bond seconded. The motion passed.

Senator Strick moved the bill be reported favorably as amended. There was no second because members wanted to wait until the "not for profit" organizations finish studying this bill and return with a compromise agreement.

Discussion was held on SB 312 which deals with state preemption of firearm regulations.

Senator Yost moved adoption of an amendment to allow cities or counties to regulate the discharge and carrying of loaded firearms in public places and allow them to enact and enforce ordinances not in conflict with state law. Senator Vidricksen seconded.

Senator Anderson made a substitute motion to report the bill unfavorably. Senator Walker seconded.

Senator Vidricksen moved the committee adjourn. The chairman declared the meeting adjourned at 11:37.
