Due to heart surgery performed on the Chairman, Senator Bogina, Senator Bud Burke was assigned to the Committee for the duration of the 1989 Legislative Session and Senator Winter, Vice-Chairman, will continue as Acting Chairman. Senator Burke gave an update on Senator Bogina's condition.

SB 386 - Fees collected by state board of healing arts

Richard Gannon pointed out that HB 2030 is the bill which allows the Board to purchase a larger computer system and SB 386 allows the Board to generate the funds to purchase the new computer. In answer to questions, Mr. Gannon stated they have not had enough time to go through the traditional rules and regulations process as the license renewals will be sent to the physicians May 1st.

Chip Wheelen, Kansas Medical Society, appeared in support of SB 386.

Senator Gaines moved, Senator Feleciano seconded, to report SB 386 favorably for passage. During discussion, it was stated that the Board of Healing Arts could go before the State Board of Rules and Regulations and the new regulations could be put in place immediately. Concern was expressed that it was a bad policy to circumvent the regulatory process when a temporary process is in place that will allow for such emergencies.

Senator Salisbury offered a substitute motion which was seconded by Senator Burke to delete the portions of the bill pertaining to the adoption of temporary regulations and include the one fee which exceeds the statutory limitations. The substitute motion failed.

The primary motion carried on a roll call vote.

SB 393 - Exchange of real estate between the secretary of administration and the First Presbyterian Church of Topeka

Senator Burke reviewed SB 393. Following discussion, Senator Johnston moved, Senator Gaines seconded, amend SB 393 by inserting language directing the use of the Dillon Building to be similar to that of the Capitol Building. The motion carried.

HB 2403 - KPERS, employment after retirement

In order that a "retirement omnibus bill" could be taken directly to conference committee, Senator Kerr moved, Senator Johnston seconded, to amend SB 216, as passed by the Senate Ways and Means Committee, into HB 2403. Following discussion, the motion carried. Senator Gaines moved, Senator Salisbury seconded, to report HB 2403, as amended, favorably for passage. The motion carried on a roll call vote.
