### INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

Senator Johnston moved, Senator Burke seconded, the introduction of two bills, one which contains the provisions clarifying the legislative intent that local land use regulations not limit or interfere with the state's ability to construct only those prison facilities pursuant to HB 2548, and another bill relating to the public sale of bonds and competitive bidding on construction of prison facilities also relating to HB 2648. The motion carried. By consensus, the Committee recommended the bills go directly to the Committee of the Whole.

### HB 2099 - Enacting handicapped and elderly public transportation assistance act

Senator Winter explained that HB 2099 relates to HB 2014, to the Highway Bill. Section 5 undertakes the transfer of funds from the State General Fund to the Elderly and Handicapped Coordinated Public Transportation Assistance Fund. It was suggested that this bill should track with the new highway funding bill and that Section 5 be amended to delete that reference and simply provide for coordination between the two bills. It was assumed that if the Highway bill passes it will have the same amount of money for this project as this bill.

Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Burke seconded, to amend Section 5, page two of HB 2099 to either delete Section 5 or make it conform with the appropriation in the Highway Bill. The motion carried.

Senator Feleciano moved, Senator Allen seconded, to report HB 2099, as amended, favorably for passage. The Chairman asked if anyone in the room wished to comment on HB 2099. There was no answer. The motion carried on a roll call vote.

The Senator Winter expressed his appreciation for all of the good work and help by the Committee and staff.

The meeting was adjourned.
