Dear Senator Burke:

During committee deliberations this session the Senate Ways and Means Committee agreed to request interim studies on several subjects. The Committee requests that the Legislative Coordinating Council designate special committees to study each of the following proposals. Detailed statements are attached.

- A review of franchise taxes, possibility of raising the taxes and comparison of Kansas franchise taxes with other states. (SB 80, Secretary of State)
- A review of the alcohol and drug abuse treatment system and related issues, <u>i.e.</u>, continuum of care for substance abusers. (HB 2028, SRS)
- 3. A review of the classification of health care providers at state institutions, especially in the Kansas City area for the recruitment and retention of nurses. (SB 350)
- 4. A review by the Budget Committee or Legislative Coordinating Council of the utilization of computer hardware and software by the Division of Information Systems and Communication (DISC).

It is further requested that the special committees make reports and recommendations to the 1990 session of the Legislature.

Subcommittee notes that 87.1 percent of the communications budget has been expended to date and invites the House Subcommittee to review this item further to determine if additional funding is required.

- 3. Delete 1.0 FTE Office Assistant position from the Uniform Commercial Code program. The Subcommittee has been informed that the position has remained vacant for over two years, with the funding for the position being utilized to finance temporary salaries on an as needed basis. The Subcommittee concurs with the use of temporary employees and so leaves the funding for the deleted position within the agency's budget for that purpose. The Subcommittee notes that deletion of the position should have no effect on the agency's operations.
- The Subcommittee notes that any unencumbered balance remaining in the State Census account will lapse at the end of FY 1989.
- 5. The Subcommittee recommends that the Secretary of State, the Revisor of Statutes, and the State Printer review the circumstances regarding the late delivery of the supplements and replacement volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated and report to the House Subcommittee on any finding and recommendations to prevent future occurrences of late delivery. Subcommittee members received a considerable number of complaints regarding the timeliness of the availability of the publications.
- The Subcommittee has been informed that the Corporation program has produced significant amounts of revenue for the State General Fund over 6. the past few years. The Subcommittee notes that the minimum of \$20 and maximum of \$2,500 for the franchise tax, which is payable upon the filing of a corporation's report, has not been raised since at least 1972. The Subcommittee has been informed that the Secretary of State's Office performed a study last year estimating the fiscal impact of raising the maximum franchise tax, but due to time limitations the Subcommittee was unable to review this study. The Subcommittee invites the House Appropriations Subcommittee to study this issue further. If the House Appropriations Subcommittee is unable to review this issue, the Subcommittee recommends that franchise taxes be reviewed during the 1989 interim, particularly how the Kansas rates compare with other states. The following is a table summarizing receipts to the State General Fund produced by the Corporation program in the last four fiscal years as recorded in the budgets for the Secretary of State.

Senate Subcommittee Recommendations

The Senate Subcommittee concurs with the recommendations of the House, with the following adjustments:

- Restore 20.5 vacant positions deleted by the House and restore \$473,634
 (\$188,346 SGF) for salaries and wages. The Senate Subcommittee is
 concerned that many of the positions to be deleted are in field offices.
- Concur with the House recommendation to add \$547,918 (\$399,980) and 24 positions for social services to prevent out-of-home placement of children. However, the Senate Subcommittee recommends that distribution of these additional staff be left to the agency's discretion instead of requiring the establishment of one large or two small family preservation projects.
- 3. Concur with the House recommendation that the Legislature undertake an interim study of the alcohol and drug abuse treatment system and related issues, including the lack of a continuum of care for substance abusers. The Senate Subcommittee also requests that the Division of Post Audit be directed to conduct a study of the current service system.
- Add \$1,000,000 from the State General Fund for alcohol and drug abuse after-care services, including \$750,000 for three additional reintegration

The Senate Ways and Means Committee requests an interim be to study the difficulties state agencies and assigned institutions employing health care personnel continue to have in retaining adequate numbers of said personnel. While these will principally be nurses it would also extend to other classes or positions such as medical technologists, raspatory therapists, physical therapists, occupational therapists, etc. University of Kansas Medical Center offered a proposal session to seek authority to unclassify all health care employees and SB 350 was enacted in a limited form giving some limited authority. The interim study should include as a part of its study topic monitoring the University's implementation of SB 350. The number of the personnel rating classes of medical technicians might be addressed in Phase IV of the job rate study. interim study should determine if the implementation of Phase IV would be adequate to meet the needs of state agencies and state hospitals.
