MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

Chairman Crumbaker called the meeting to order at 12:25.

The chairman called attention to HB 2960, concerning bid requirements in school districts.

Representative R. D. Miller moved HB 2960 be passed favorably. Seconded by Representative Harder. Motion carried.

The chair brought HB 2727, concerning community colleges, residence of students for tuition, out-district tuition, and state aid, before the committee.

Representative David Miller moved the House Education Committee recommend HB 2727 for interim study since the contents of HB 2727 are the same as in SB 608 which the Senate Education Committee is recommending for interim study. Representative Williams seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The chair opened HB 2818, concerning prohibition of corporal punishment in school districts, for discussion.

Representative Branson offered an amendment to HB 2818 to strike "inflicted" and insert "incurred" on page 1, in line 18. Representative Jones seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Representative Branson moved HB 2818 be reported favorably as amended. Seconded by Representative Reardon. The chair opened the floor for discussion. Representative Ramirez moved to table HB 2818. Seconded by Representative Lane. There were 12 votes to table H.B 2818. Motion to table HB 2818 carried.

The meeting was adjourned by the chair at 12:35 p.m.
