DISCUSSION AND ACTION ON SB 803 Alcohol and drug related offenses, suspension and revocation of drivers' licenses

The Chairman explained the bill provides that the 90 days' imprisonment mandated on a third or subsequent conviction may be served in a work release program only after such person has served 48 consecutive hours' imprisonment, provided such work release program requires such person to confinement at the end of each day in the work release program.

Representative Gomez moved to amend the bill by providing that on a second conviction a person, after serving 48 consecutive hours' imprisonment, can be placed on a work release program for 8 days. Representative Hochhauser seconded the motion. The motion failed.

Representative Solbach moved and Representative Lawrence seconded to change the language for a second conviction to a mandated 5 days' imprisonment that may be served in a work release program only after such person has served 48 consecutive hours' imprisonment. The motion failed.

Representative Everhart moved and Representative Jenkins seconded to change the third conviction from "48 consecutive hours' imprisonment" to "5 consecutive days' imprisonment". After Committee discussion, the motion was withdrawn.

Representative Vancrum moved to report SB 803 favorably for passage. Representative Douville seconded the motion. The motion failed.

Representative Vancrum moved and Representative Jenkins seconded to change the language for a second conviction to "48 consecutive hours' imprisonment must be served before the five days' imprisonment can be served in a work release program". The motion passed.

Representative Sebelius moved to report SB 803, as amended, favorably for passage. Representative Jenkins seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The Committee meeting adjourned at 11:40 a.m.
