Conferees appearing before the committee:

Action on: SB 428 - Simplified procedures for license to conduct race meetings by county fair associations

A motion was made by Senator Morris and seconded by Senator Bond that the bill be recommended favorably for passage. The motion carried.

Action on: SB 588 - Prohibiting cities and counties from owning or operating certain correctional facilities

A conceptual motion was made by Senator Bond and seconded by Senator Vidricksen that the following entities be exempted from the provision of this bill: community corrections, work release, county, city, or federal facilities, and juvenile detention facilities. The motion carried.

Action on: SB 596 - KFDA financing for Labette county corrections conservation camp facility

A motion was made by Senator Bond and seconded by Senator Morris to recommend the bill favorably for passage. The motion carried.

Action on: HB 2844 - Making Kansas lottery subject to the sunset law

A motion was made by Senator Bond and seconded by Senator McClure to recommend the bill favorably for passage.

A substitute motion was made by Senator Morris and seconded by Senator Vidricksen to change the year of the sunset to 1994. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator Morris and seconded by Senator Strick to recommend the bill favorably as amended. The motion failed.

Recorded "no" votes were Senators Bond, Daniels, and Vidricksen.

Action on: SB 630: Display of identification documents upon premises licensed for the sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages

A conceptual motion was made by Senator Bond and seconded by Senator Strick that Line 14 refer to "licensed premises. . . for the purpose of purchasing to consume" and that a violator under 18 would be considered a juvenile offender rather than a child in need of care. The motion carried.

AN ACT concerning the governor's residence advisory commission;  
amending K.S.A. 75-130 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 75-130 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-130. (a) The governor's residence advisory commission shall meet at least quarterly.

(b) The governor's residence advisory commission shall examine the governor's residence at least once each year and shall report to the legislature annually on the condition and state of repair of the-governor's such residence and its grounds and appurtenances, including fixed and movable equipment. The commission may incorporate within its report specific recommendations for furnishings, fixtures, security devices and systems, remodeling, repairs, replacements, additions and other improvements or alterations to the governor's residence and its grounds and appurtenances, including fixed and movable equipment.

(c) No substantial addition, deletion or other alteration shall be made to the governor's residence or its contents, grounds or appurtenances without the prior approval of the governor's residence advisory commission.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 75-130 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
