MINUTES OF THE Senate COMMITTEE ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT

The meeting was called to order by Sen. Don Montgomery at

The Chairman began the meeting with welcoming the committee back and then called on Ernie Mosher, League of Kansas Municipalities, to present a review of bills held in committee from last year and to request the introduction of bills. Mr. Mosher distributed copies of the summary of bills in committee. (See Attachment I.) Mr. Mosher began with requests for the introduction of three bills. (See Attachments II through IV.) The first proposed bill concerning investment of interest of municipal utility deposits would amend KSA 12-822. Sen. Allen made a motion for the introduction of the bill, Sen. Lee seconded, and the motion carried.

Mr. Mosher continued with an explanation of the second proposed bill regarding Kansas Development Finance Authority (KDFA) financing of tax anticipation notes. Mr. Mosher feels there is a need for this bill because he thinks there will be severe consequences regarding the payment of property taxes with the recent reappraisal. Sen. Daniels made a motion to introduce the bill, Sen. Petty seconded. Sen. Gaines said he feels that the KDFA does not need to be involved in local government on a whim by the League that this money will be needed. He asked Mr. Mosher for an example of the need for the bill. Mr. Mosher replied that the proposed bill is not a result of a whim and that it had been in existence during the special session. He could not give an example of need, however, he feels that there will be some cash shortages. The Chairman noted that the intent of the proposed bill is to try to establish a broader area and asked John Torbert of the Kansas Association of Counties his opinion of the need for the bill. Mr. Torbert said that he knows there will be a problem but does not know how extensive it will be. On a call for a vote on Sen. Daniels' motion, the motion carried.

Mr. Mosher continued with a discussion of his third request for the introduction of a bill which deals with KDFA financing of municipal lease-purchase equipment. The proposed bill is a result of concerns which had been expressed by former Senator Joe Warren. The chairman reminded the committee of information which he had distributed to them earlier. (See Attachment V.) He noted that Mr. Ervin would be willing to testify. Mr. Mosher said this proposal would result in significant savings at the local level. He anticipates that there will be a question raised as to if the state government should be involved in local matters, however, the state has indicated that it would be willing and able to handle it.

The Chairman began a discussion of the proposal by asking Mr. Mosher how it would work. Mr. Mosher answered that the KDFA would own the equipment, and local governments would lease it on a year to year obligation. The KDFA probably would have to buy insurance. Sen. Burke noted that the original role of the KDFA was the financing of state government and that

the question is, should the state be allowed to compete with the private sector? This would be a new direction for the KDFA. Sen. Gaines added that he feels the bill would be unfair to the private sector because the state would be offering a lower rate. Also, he feels the state should not be involved in it. The Chairman explained that Sen. Warren's concern was that local units of government were being taken advantage of because of their lack of expertise. And secondly, there is a question as to whether the cash basis law has been circumvented in some cases where the people were not allowed to vote on building projects or proposed purchases of equipment. Sen. Frahm asked if this bill would cover buildings. Mr. Mosher said it would not. The Chairman noted that he knows of some building projects being done this way at present, however. Sen. Petty feels this proposal could result in better fiscal management on the local level if local units are given this option. Sen. Daniels questioned if all of the three proposed bills should be effective "on publication in the Kansas Register." Mr. Mosher said only the first proposal needs that.

Sen. Daniels made a motion for the introduction of the proposal regarding municipal lease-purchase equipment, Sen. Langworthy seconded, and the motion carried.

Discussion began on SB 14 regarding privatization of public services which was left in conference last session. (See Attachment I.) The Chairman reminded the committee that originally the bill included water, sewage and solid waste. However, the House amended it to include solid waste only, and it was sent to conference committee where an agreement could not be reached. Mr. Mosher said the League of Municipalities supports the bill as passed by the Senate which included water and sewage. He feels the bill is broad and flexible, and sometimes the private sector might be able to serve the municipality better. The Chairman asked if the committee felt a need to try to get water and sewage included, and if this is not possible in the present conference committee, ask for new conference committee members. The concensus was to meet again with an attempt to reach agreement.

The Chairman called on John Torbert, Kansas Association of Counties, for his comments on SB 14 and for his request for the introduction of a bill. Mr. Torbert commented that the EPA will have new regulations this spring that will triple the costs of landfills which will lead to the establishment of regional landfills which will require long-term contracts with the private sector. He supports the need for the bill as proposed by the Senate.

Mr. Torbert turned his attention to his request for the introduction of a bill regarding state mandates as they financially relate to local governments. (See Attachment VI.) Sen. Daniels questioned as to if this bill would cost the state more. Mr. Torbert said the bill would allow the state to provide funds or would allow local units the ability to get the necessary funds.

Sen. Daniels made a motion for the introduction of Mr. Torbert's bill, Sen. Allen seconded, and the motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 a.m.

BILLS IN SENATE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE

Report by League of Kansas Municipalities

SENATE BILLS

SB 35 Taxation; Mortgage Registration. By Sen. Yost. Amends K.S.A. 79-3105 and 79-3106. When a mortgage covers property located in two or more counties the mortgage registration fee shall be apportioned among the counties in which the real property is situated in proportion to its loan valuation. Current law requires that the registration fee be based upon the assessed valuation of real property. To S,LG.

Comment: League has no position.

SB 57 Municipal Group-Funded Risk Pools; Boards of Trustees.

Comment: Obsolete. Same as HB 2061, passed in 1989.

SB 85 General Bond Law; Call of Bonds. By S,LG. Amends Supp. 10-129 of the general bond law to increase from 30 to 60 days the notification period required when a municipality calls bonds before they mature. To S,LG.

Comment: League opposes. Requested by State treasurer.

SB 143 County Treasurer and Appraiser; Office Hours. By Sen. Kanan. Amends K.S.A. 19-2601 to require that the offices of county treasurer and appraiser be open the second and fourth Saturday of each month from 8:30 a.m. through noon. To S,LG.

Comment: Probably obsolete; intended for 1989.

SB 157 City Sewerage Systems. By Sen. Martin. A new act prohibiting cities from accepting for treatment sewage or wastewater produced outside the city containing chemicals "not normally found in the city's sewer lines" without first submitting the proposal to an election. To S,LG.

Comment: League opposes.

SB 235 County Treasurers. By S,LG. Requires county treasurers to complete 10 hours of "continuing professional education" each year, under program administered by municipal accounting section. To S,LG.

Comment: League has no position.

SB 279 Municipal Investment Pool Fund. By S,LG. Amends Supp. 12-1675 to allow the investment of idle public moneys in a municipal investment pool fund handled by the state treasurer. Pooled money investment board would invest pool funds in repurchase agreements or in securities authorized for investment by local units of government. To S,LG.

Comment: League supports. Requested by state treasurer.

SB 288 Cemeteries; Revestment of Title. By S,LG. Amends K.S.A. 12-1440 to allow revestment of title to burial lots in city or township cemetery if no interment has occurred for a period of at least 30 (now 50) years. To S,LG.

Comment: League has no position.

SB 372 Watershed District Elections. By S,FSA. Amends K.S.A. 24-1208. To provide that the cost of watershed district elections shall be distributed equally to each landowner (now on basis of assessed valuation). To S,LG.

Comment: League has no position.

HOUSE BILLS

HB 2256 BPU; Procedure for Sale. By Rep. Johnson and others. A new act providing that prior to the sale of a municipal water and/or electric plant operated under K.S.A. 13-1220 (Kansas City Board of Public Utilities) the city must conduct a feasibility study of the proposed sale by a professional consultant; provide notice and public hearing; and hold a referendum. To S,LG.

Comment: Probably obsolete. League has no position.

HB 2475 Nuisance Law; Property Lien. By H,LG. Amends Supp. 12-1617e, 12-1617f and 12-1755 to provide that unpaid charges resulting from city nuisance abatement activities constitute a lien against property if unpaid after 30 days. Requires city clerk to file notice of a lien with the register of deeds within 10 days after 30 day payment period. If lien is not filed, city loses right to enforce it. To S,LG.

Comment: League against unless amended.

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

SB 14. Privatization of Public Services. Authorizes cities and counties to contract with a private contractor for up to 30 years to furnish certain capital intensive public services. Requires notice and hearing before adopting agreement, which is subject to a protect and referendum. Allows use of revenues to pay service fee to private contractor and (House amendment) restricts amount of fee to 50% of municipality's bonded debt limit. Allows a municipality to acquire land by eminent domain for lease to the private contractor. Amends K.S.A. 10-116 to exempt service agreement payments under the new act from the cash basis law. Senate version applies to refuse, water and sewerage services; House version limited to solid waste. Conferees are Sen. Montgomery, Allen and Daniels; Rep. Miller R.D., Brown and Johnson.

Comment: League supports Senate version.

Proposed Bill

Investment of Interest of Municipal Utility Deposits

Recommended by the League of Kansas Municipalities

12-822. Deposits to secure payment of bills; unlawful, when; investment; abandoned deposits, disposition. It shall be unlawful for any public or municipally owned utility doing business in the state of Kansas to receive or collect a deposit from any customer as security for the payment of bills for service rendered, unless such public or municipally owned utility shall keep a separate account of the date on which such deposit is received, the name of the depositor, and the amount thereof, and shall pay to the customer making the deposit interest at the rate determined by the state corporation commission. Such interest shall be credited once a year or credited on January 1 thereafter, to such customer's outstanding account, unless, prior to January 1, such customer shall request the payment of such interest in cash, in which event payment of interest shall be made as requested. Any interest credited shall be subject to call and payment at any time, but shall not draw interest.

The amount of deposit required shall at all times be reasonable, and shall be based upon the value of the maximum service rendered; and such advance deposit, together with the interest due thereon, may be applied to the payment of any accrued bills, or bills due on discontinuance of service. Deposits by customers so held as security for service or for meters ~~at the taking effect of this act shall draw interest from that date and be credited and paid as herein provided.~~ Any municipally owned utility ~~doing business in the state of Kansas~~ may invest money received as customers' deposits ~~as herein provided,~~ in investments authorized by K.S.A. 12-1675, ~~and amendments thereto, in the manner prescribed therein or in bonds of the state of Kansas, or general improvement bonds of cities of the first and second class, or bonds of any county wherein a city of the first or second class located within the state, or bonds of the boards of education in cities of the first class of this state, or bonds issued or guaranteed by the United States government,~~ savings accounts of commercial banks or trust companies.

the money is credited is unknown and a reasonable effort has been made to determine the same; and

(d) following the expiration of the three-year period, the utility has published once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the utility is located, a notice listing any person whose deposit remains on account, and that a demand for such money must be made within 60 days. Any security deposits remaining in the account of any such customer 60 days after the last publication of such notice shall be placed in the operating fund of the utility.

Any ~~amount of~~ security deposit, and the accrued interest thereon remaining in the account of any customer of a municipally

utility who has discontinued service with such utility shall be placed in the operating fund of such utility, upon the following conditions: (a) Such money has remained on deposit ~~with the municipal utility~~ for a period of more than three years from the date service was discontinued;

(b) no demand for such money ~~has been made at any time during the three-year period;~~

(c) the whereabouts of the person to whose account

Proposed Bill

KDFA Financing of Tax Anticipation Notes

Recommended by the League of Kansas Municipalities

Section 1. The provisions of subsection (a) of K.S.A. 1989 Supp. 74-8905 and amendments thereto shall not prohibit the issuance of bonds by the Kansas development finance authority for the purpose of acquiring tax anticipation notes or no-fund warrants issued by taxing districts in accordance with Sec. 6 of House Bill No. 2001, enacted by the 1989 special session of the legislature, and any such issuance of bonds is exempt from the provisions of subsection (a) of K.S.A. 1989 Supp. 74-8905 and amendments thereto.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

Proposed Bill

KDFA Financing of Municipal Lease-Purchase Equipment

Recommended by the League of Kansas Municipalities

Section 1. The provisions of subsection (a) of K.S.A. 1989 Supp. 74-8905 and amendments thereto shall not prohibit the issuance of bonds by the Kansas development finance authority for the purpose of acquiring equipment and entering into lease with option to purchase agreements for such equipment with political subdivisions and any such issuance of bonds is exempt from the provisions of subsection (a) of K.S.A. 1989 Supp. 74-8905 and amendments thereto.

For the purpose of this act, equipment shall include equipment, machinery, vehicles and any other equipment or personal property which the political subdivision is authorized to lease or purchase and use for public purposes.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

One of the association's top priorities for this legislative session is as follows:

Background/Rationale- The issue of mandates is becoming an increasingly sensitive one for local officials. The federal government has written itself out of any federal/local financial partnership leaving state and local government holding the bag. With increasingly stretched state fiscal resources, local government often becomes the convenient answer as a home for well intentioned yet costly programs that no one else has the ability or desire to fund. A mandate is especially insidious in that it means that the money to pay for the mandate must be "borrowed" from another program or, taxes must be raised. They often become hidden taxes because it gives the state the ability to initiate a program without having to actually pay for it.

Recommendation- Out a sense of fiscal fair play and truth in taxation, a constitutional amendment is needed to give local governments relief from mandates. Such an amendment would specify that any new law or regulation that required additional expenditures by local government (either in terms human or monetary resources) would have to be matched with additional state funding or increased fiscal capacity for local government.

The issue of mandates has seen increasing activity in state capitals in recent years. The U.S. General Accounting Office reports that there are now 14 states that have mandate reimbursement legislation in place. They have met with varying degrees of success. Recently, the Florida legislature approved a constitutional provision relating to mandates that will go before the Florida voters some time this year. Passage is expected.

We are suggesting a constitutional amendment that would be modeled after the one approved in Florida. The basic elements of that approach are as follows;

No city or county can be bound by any law requiring expenditure of funds or the taking of an action that would require the expenditure of funds unless the legislature has determined that such a law fulfills an important state interest and unless 1) funds have been appropriated that are estimated to be sufficient to fund such expenditure or, 2) the legislature authorizes or has authorized a local government to enact a funding source not previously available by a simple majority vote of the governing body. These provisions can be superseded if a "super majority" vote (three-fourths has been suggested) of the legislature approves any changes.

Further, before the legislature can pass any law that would reduce the percentage of state taxes shared with cities and counties, the same three-fourths vote would be necessary.

Certain exemptions to this constitutional provision are also allowed such as election laws, laws reauthorizing but not expanding previous mandates and laws that have an insignificant fiscal impact.

Our preference would be for provisions that were broader than these. We would like the ability, for example, to backtrack and examine some of the mandates already in place. However, politics, as always, is the art of the practical. We believe that the approach outlined here, or one similar to it, while not prohibiting mandates, would do a great deal on raising the consciousness level among legislators and the general public. That, we feel, is a matter of fiscal fairness that will benefit all of Kansas.
