Dear Senator Burke:

During committee deliberations this session, the Senate Ways and Means Committee agreed to request interim studies on several subjects. The Committee requests that the Legislative Coordinating Council designate special committees to study each of the following proposals:

1. Regents enrollment adjustment funding process
2. Shrinkage of unclassified salaries in Regents institutions
3. The K.U. Medical Center mission and activities (including funding)
4. Growing population of the elderly and increasing costs of care; exploring ways to bring additional tax dollars into the system
5. Community based facilities for the mentally retarded
6. Community based facilities for the elderly, including study of the coordination of services between SRS and the Department on Aging
7. Monitor development of community corrections
8. SB 423 - Military retirements benefits exempt from income taxation (Referred to Interim Budget Committee by Ways and Means)
9. Private prisons

10. Regents KPERS -- The Conference Committee on Retirement requested a review of members ability to "pad" or increase final average salary calculation above normal annual salary amounts

It is further requested that the special committees make reports and recommendations to the 1991 session of the Legislature.
