Chairperson Gjerstad called the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m.

The Chair asked for further discussion and possible final action on H.B. 2179. Representative Weimer was recognized. He stated that due to further discussion and research of this bill and not fully understanding the system of financing from the mill levy system as originally proposed in the first bill, and change over to expansion of per pupil budget, it became clear the bill would work satisfactorily on the two mill system. Representative Weimer made a motion to reconsider previous action of March 6, 1991. Seconded by Representative Bishop. Motion carried.

Discussion was held on Representative Weimer's amendment.

Representative Sader made a substitute motion to amend Page 1, line 36 of the original bill to 5 percent. Seconded by Representative Weimer. Motion carried.

Representative Bradford made a motion to amend Page 2, line 42 to include the following sentence: "As used in this section, "technology education program" means a program to incorporate electronic computer and communications technologies into educational programs of the school district, including improvement and integration on on-line information management and communications systems in all application areas." Seconded by Representative Baker. Motion carried.

Representative Bishop made a motion to pass the bill favorably as amended. Seconded by Representative Sader. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:30 p.m.
