MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

The meeting was called to order by Representative Rick Bowden at

Chairman Bowden opened the meeting at 7:00 a.m.

Discussion was opened on HB 2561. Rep. Harder moved that in line 16, Great Bend be changed to Barton County. It was seconded by Rep. Ramirez. Motion carried. Rep. Harder made a conceptual motion that would allow Hutchinson Community College to purchase the land needed to build the repeater station. It was seconded by Rep. Crumbaker. Motion carried. Rep. Harder then made the motion to pass HB 2561 as amended out of committee. It was seconded by Rep. Empson. Motion carried.

Chairman Bowden then opened SB 285 for discussion. Rep. Empson made the motion to move SB 285 out of committee and be placed on the consent calendar. It was seconded by Rep. Amos. Motion carried.

Discussion was then opened on SB 26. Rep. Crumbaker offered an amendment that would put 10 mill levy on all school districts along with a 1% increase on taxable personal income. It would remove the 3/5 provision on the mill levies. It was seconded by Rep. Empson. Motion failed with a vote of 6 for and 15 against the amendment. Extensive discussion on this motion took place. Discussion of the bill was to be continued at the next meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 9:05 a.m. with the next meeting scheduled for Thursday, March 28, 1991 in room 519-S at 3:30 p.m.
