Conferees appearing before the committee:

Chairman Bowden opened the meeting at 3:30 p.m. SB 107 was opened for discussion. Rep. Lane made a motion to move the bill favorably out of committee. It was seconded by Rep. Lahti. Motion carried.

SB 143 was then brought up for discussion. Rep. Wiard made a motion to amend the bill in Line 3, page 2 to strike the words "be held" and insert the word "commence" and in line 4 after a member "unless the committee votes for an extension". It was seconded by Rep. Benlon. Motion carried. Rep. Amos moved to amend the bill on line 38 page 1 to read teacher, board,. It was seconded by Rep. Reinhardt. Motion carried. Rep. Crumbaker made the motion to move the bill as amended favorably out of committee. It was seconded by Rep. Empson. Motion carried.

The next bill brought to the committee's attention was SB 63. Discussion took place and Rep. Wiard moved to pass the bill favorably out of committee. It was seconded by Rep. Hackler. Motion carried.

The Chairman then opened discussion on SB 47. Rep. Crumbaker made the motion to amend the bill because it conflicts with SB 63. Rep. Empson seconded the motion.

Chairman Bowden offered an amendment to remove certain sections of the existing bill. Rep. Amos motioned to amend the bill. It was seconded by Rep. Wiard. Motion carried.

Rep. Crumbaker with the prevailing side requested SB 63 to be reconsidered. On voice vote, the motion to reconsider SB 63 prevailed. Discussion took place on the bill and an amendment was given. Rep. Empson motioned to amend the bill it was seconded by Rep. Reinhardt. Motion carried.

Rep. Hensley motioned to amend SB 47 and Rep. Reinhardt seconded the motion. Motion carried. Rep. Crumbaker made the motion to pass SB 47 as amended favorably out of committee. Rep. Empson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Rep. Reinhardt moved that SB 63 be passed favorably as amended out of committee. It was seconded by Rep. Wiard. Motion carried. Being reconrded as voting "no" on the bill was Rep. M. Smith.

Chairman Bowden then opened discussion on SB 101 regarding high school students taking college classes for credit. Discussion took place and it was suggested that the bill needed closer investigation of the bill and that it should be sent to the LEPC for review this summer. Rep. Praeger motioned to lay the bill on the table. It was seconded by Rep. Jones. Motion carried. Chairman Bowden informed the committee he would send a letter to the Chairman of the LEPC asking for consideration to review the bill.
