The meeting was called to order at 12:23 p.m. by the chairman, Rep. Anthony Hensley.

Chairman Hensley announced discussion and final action on House Bill No. 2076, the Family and Medical Leave Act. He reiterated his intention of asking the Majority Leader to re-refer the bill to committee to be held over for interim committee study. He said he would write a letter to the Legislative Coordinating Council requesting such a study.

Rep. Denise Everhart moved to amend House Bill No. 2076 on page 1, line 40, by adding the words, "or a licensed social worker." Rep. Diane Gjerstad seconded the motion. The motion carried by a vote of 9 to 8.

After discussion, Rep. Darrel Webb moved to report House Bill No. 2076 favorable for passage, as amended. Rep. Everhart seconded the motion.

On a substitute motion, Dorothy Flottman moved that House Bill No. 2076 be tabled. Rep. Gene Amos seconded the motion. Motion failed.

Rep. Webb renewed his motion that House Bill No. 2076 be reported favorable, as amended. Motion carried with Representatives Amos, Garry Boston, Darlene Cornfield, Gary Hayzlett, Al Lane, Jack Sluiter and Susan Wagle recorded voting "No."

Chairman Hensley announced the continuation of the hearing on House Bill No. 2620. He recognized Robert Anderson, Director, Kansas Division of Workers' Compensation, who answered questions from several members of the committee.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:55 p.m. The next meeting is on call of the chairman.
