Conferees appearing before the committee:

Chairman Wagnon called the committee to order at 9:10 a.m. for discussion and action on bills previously heard. First bill for consideration was HB 2381.

Rep. Ensminger made a motion to raise the tax liability exemption limit in HB 2381 from \$2 to \$10. Rep. Shore seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Rep. Snowbarger made a motion to conform K.S.A. 79-330, the oil and gas tax liability cancellation provision, to the provisions of HB 2381. Rep. Grotewiel seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Rep. Larkin made a motion to pass HB 2381, as amended, favorably. Rep. Grotewiel seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The committee next considered HB 2546, the local option intangibles tax.

Rep. Krehbiel made a motion to pass HB 2546 favorably. Rep. Harder seconded the motion.

Tom Severn from Legislative Research stated that the intangibles tax outlined in HB 2546 was deductible on federal tax returns, but not deductible on state returns. The motion carried.

The Chair then reopened consideration of Sub. HB 2113.

A draft of Sub. HB 2113 was distributed to the committee. Don Hayward, Revisor, discussed the provisions of the bill and answered questions for clarification.

Rep. Welshimer made a motion to raise the gross receipts tax on 900 phone numbers from 4.25 percent, as currently in HB 2113, to 4.5 percent. Rep. Campbell seconded the motion. The motion

Rep. Vancrum made a substitute motion to remove corporations from HB 2346. His motion died for lack of a second.

The motion of Rep. Shore carried.

Rep. Snowbarger made a motion to introduce a bill to expedite procedures of the Kansas Corporation Commission. Rep. Pottorff seconded the motion. The motion carried.

The committee adjourned at 9:53 a.m.
