MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Senator Wint Winter Jr. at 12:30 p.m. on April 3, 1991 in room 123-S of the Capitol.

All members were present except: Senators Yost, Feleciano and Gaines who were excused.

Conferees appearing before the committee:

Chairman Winter called the meeting to order by calling for discussion and action on bills previously heard by the Committee.

HB 2469 - release of taxes during bankruptcy.

Discussion by the Committee reviewed the Subcommittee on Civil Procedure recommendations.

Senator Martin moved to adopt the amendment suggested by the Department of Revenue and contained in the Subcommittee recommendation. Senator Kerr seconded the motion.

Following lengthy discussion by the Committee on the mechanics of bankruptcy law, how the law relates to counties and their abilities to collect taxes, and various aspects of the federal law, Senator Martin withdrew his motion to amend and Senator Kerr withdrew his second. The Committee decided to address the subject again at a later date.

HB 2500 - juvenile felons considered adults when convicted of lesser included offenses.

Senator Bond reported he was checking with experts in the field and would be ready to report to the Committee at a later meeting.

HB 2481 - attachment of KPERS for maintenance.

Following detailed discussion by the Committee, some members felt an interim study of the bigger and broader problem would be appropriate. It was noted the major concern expressed by Marshall Crowther, Executive Director of KPERS, was computations for interest on past amounts if added to the required payments.

Senator Moran moved to amend HB 2481 as suggested by the Office of Judicial Administration (see Attachment 1 of March 28, 1991 minutes of the Judiciary Subcommittee on Civil Procedure) and to recommend the bill favorable as amended. Senator Rock seconded the motion. The motion carried.

HB 2004 - amendments to the Kansas parentage act; validity or reports; presumption of conception; interlocutory orders.

Senator Martin moved to recommend HB 2004 favorable for passage and to be placed on the Consent Calendar. Senator Rock seconded the motion. The motion carried.

HB 2005 - physician's statement as consideration in termination of parental rights.

Senator Bond moved to adopt the amendment to HB 2005 as suggested by the Kansas Psychiatric Society (see attachment 7 of the 10:05 a.m., April 3, 1991 minutes). Senator Martin seconded the motion. The motion to amend carried.

Senator Martin moved to recommend HB 2005 favorable as amended. Senator Petty seconded the motion. The motion carried.

HB 2006 - fees charged for enforcement of support orders by office of court trustee.

HB 2100 - proceedings to terminate parental rights in adoption.

Senator Rock moved to amend HB 2100 by removing the House amendments requiring involvement of an unknown parent or one who has ben absent responsibility for two years or more. Senator Parrish seconded the motion. The motion to amend carried.

Senator Rock moved to recommend HB 2100 favorable for passage as amended. Senator Parrish seconded the motion. The motion carried.
