MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Senator Wint Winter Jr. at
1:45 p.m. on April 12, 1991 in room 313-S of the Capitol.

All members were present except: Senators Yost, Bond, Feleciano, Gaines, Morris and Oleen
who were excused.

Conferees appearing before the committee:

Chairman Winter opened the meeting by reviewing SB 206 and HB 2012.

SB 206 - disposition of moneys credited to the juvenile detention facilities fund.
HB 2012 - advisory commission on juvenile offender programs as state advisory group for
purposes of federal juvenile justice and delinquency prevention act.

The Chairman suggested combining the two measures, short of altering the correction funds. That
would coordinate the effort combine under one authority but not alter the existing percentages of
funding distribution.

Senator Parrish moved to amend HB 2012 to combine the Juvenile Detention Facilities Fund and
the Juvenile Detention Facilities Capital Improvements Fund, merging under one jurisdiction with
the Advisory Commission on Juvenile Offender Programs. Senator Moran seconded the motion.
The motion to amend carried.

Senator Parrish moved to further amend HB 2012 to replace one of the Governor appointees with a
person designated by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. Senator Petty seconded
the motion. The motion to further amend carried.

Senator Parrish moved to further amend HB 2012 by incorporating the language of SB 206.
Senator Petty seconded the motion. The motion to further amend carried.

It was the consensus of the Committee that the HB 2012 as amended gives the Advisory
Commission on Juvenile Offender Programs the control to give grants without further legislative
action.

Senator Petty moved to recommend HB 2012 favorably as amended. Senator Moran seconded the
motion. The motion carried.

HB 2500 - juvenile felons considered adults when convicted of lesser included offenses.

Senator Parrish moved to recommend HB 2500 favorable for passage. Senator Rock seconded the
motion. The motion carried.

HB 2469 - release of taxes during bankruptcy.

Senator Rock moved to amend HB 2469 to provide that the county's abatement authority be limited
to those claims which are dischargeable in bankruptcy, and that the county's action be subject to
approval by the state board of tax appeals. Senator Martin seconded the motion. The motion to
amend carried.

Senator Rock moved to recommend HB 2469 favorable as amended. Senator Martin seconded the
motion. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.
