The meeting was called to order at approximately 9:00 a.m., by Chairman Dean, commencing with discussion of H.B. 3089, Cable Television.

Rep. Patrick moved to table the bill. Seconded by Rep. Mead. Motion carried.

After brief discussion of H.B. 3090 concerning alcohol and drug testing procedures, Rep. McKechnie moved to table. Seconded by Rep. Patrick. Motion carried.

H.B. 2945 relating to pay-per-call service was discussed. Rep. Patrick felt the bill was premature and moved to table. Rep. McKechnie seconded. Motion carried.

After comments from Julian Efird concerning H.B. 3088 and its application to the Board of Regents institutions, Rep. Patrick moved to pass out favorably with amendments, H.B. 3088 concerning acquisition of data processing equipment for state agencies. Seconded by Rep. McKechnie. Motion carried.

Rep. McKechnie moved to reconsider committee's previous action on H.B. 3088. Seconded by Rep. Mead. Motion carried.

Rep. McKechnie moved to amend the bill statement, page 2, line 32, to exempt regents wherever it is needed. Seconded by Rep. Mead. Motion carried.

Rep. McKechnie moved to add a line that the Secretary of Administration shall be given the authority by rules and regulations to develop minimum thresholds under section e. Seconded by Rep. Kline. Motion carried.

Rep. McKechnie moved to pass out favorably, as amended, H.B. 3088. Seconded by Rep. Mead. Motion carried.

There being no further business at this time, the committee adjourned until Wednesday, March 18, 1992.
