Chairman Dean opened the meeting by presenting the minutes from the meeting of March 3. Rep Patrick moved for approval of the minutes. Seconded by Rep. McKechnie. Motion carried.

Rep. Pauls reviewed the sub-committee's conclusion and proposed amendments to S.B. 626, concerning pirated recordings and non-disclosure of source of recordings. She stated, with the adoption of the proposed amendments, they would recommend the bill be passed out favorably, and so moved. Seconded by Rep. McKechnie. Motion carried.

A substitute bill for H.B. 3143 concerning the development of a uniform database of offender information was reviewed by Revisor Jim Wilson (attachment 1). Rep. Patrick moved for the adoption of the substitute bill. Seconded by Rep. Rock. Motion carried.

Subsequently, Rep. Patrick moved to change the effective date of July 1, 1993, in the statute book to the Kansas Register. Seconded by Rep. McKechnie. Motion carried.

Rep. McKechnie moved to pass out substitute for H.B. 3143, as further amended. Seconded by Rep. Patrick. Motion carried.

Brent Binkston, Director of Governor's Task Force on Drug Abuse, appeared before the committee stating he would like to be included as one of the task force members in the above bill. The committee stated the bill is fairly narrow in focus and had made a conscious decision to limit the size; however, it was pointed out a member of the task force could, if they see a need for it, include others to participate on an ad hoc basis. Mr. Binkston stated, at the very least, he would like to be notified of all meetings, so this information could be utilized along with other work he will be doing in connection with drug abuse and criminal justice history records.

Secretary Stotts appeared before the committee addressing his recommendation of sentencing guidelines which included a criminal justice council. He is still pursuing this and stated if successful, didn't want to create any conflict with the above task force. He also stated, if acceptable, Mr. Binkston could participate with his council.

Rep. McKechnie moved to add to Section 1, sub-section 1-5: the five appointed task force members could appoint not more than two other members to the task force on a unanimous vote of those five members. No second was made. Motion died.

Rep. Patrick moved to pass out the substitute for H.B. 3143, favorably as amended. Rep. Rock seconded. Motion carried.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned until Wednesday, April 8, 1992.

Substitute for HOUSE BILL NO. 3143

By Committee on Computers, Communications and Technology

AN ACT establishing a task force on criminal justice information, relating to the development of a uniform database of information regarding adult and juvenile offenders and children in need of care under court service officer supervision.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) There is hereby established the task force on criminal justice information which shall be composed of the following:

(1) A representative from the office of judicial administration appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court, who shall be the chairperson of the task force;

(2) the director of the Kansas bureau of investigation, or the director's designee;

(3) the director of information systems and communications of the department of administration, or the director's designee;

(4) the secretary of corrections, or the secretary's designee; and

(5) the secretary of social and rehabilitation services, or the secretary's designee.

(b) The task force on criminal justice information shall meet on call of the chairperson and shall study and develop recommendations for the standards for and types of data to be included in a common, uniform database of offender information and information regarding children in need of care under supervision of court services officers. The task force on criminal justice information shall submit a report to the committee on ways and means of the senate and the committee on appropriations and the committee on computers, communications and

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technology of the house of representatives at the beginning of the 1993 regular session of the legislature. In developing such recommendations, the task force shall consider:

(1) The data collected by the courts, community corrections programs and parole programs regarding adult and juvenile offenders placed in nonincarcerative dispositions and children in need of care under supervision of court service officers;

(2) the location or locations of the data recommended to be collected and maintained; and

(3) the level and nature of authorized access to such data, including access by court services officers, community corrections officers and parole officers.

(c) The Kansas sentencing commission shall provide staff and support services for the task force on criminal justice information.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
