Conferees appearing before the committee:

Chair Sebelius opened the meeting with requests for bill introduction. She explained that the first request is from the Secretary of S.R.S. and the Superintendent from Topeka State Hospital and deals with where competency hearings and presentence evaluations must take place.

Representative Roy moved that the bill be introduced to specify that Larned be the place where competency hearings and presentence evaluations take place. Representative Wagnon made a second to the motion, which passed on a voice vote.

Representative Jones explained that he has a request to introduce a bill which deals with state contracts and minority participation.

Representative Long moved that the bill dealing with state contracts and minority participation be introduced. Representative Gilbert made a second to the motion, which passed on a voice vote.

Chair Sebelius reminded the Committee that there were hearings on this bill on March 5, 1992. She explained that this bill needed to be moved through or there would be a loss of federal dollars.

Representative Wagnon moved that HB 3164 be reported favorable for passage, and be put on the Consent Calendar. Representative Ramirez made a second to the motion, which passed on a voice vote.

Chair Sebelius explained that there are changes on page 7 in subsection H, and at the bottom of page 7 that are penalty changes that are identical to what federal regulations state. This will bring us into compliance with federal law.

Chair Sebelius adjourned the meeting.
