Hearing on SB 624, enacting the uniform statutory rule against perpetuities, was opened.

Ron Smith, Kansas Bar Association, testified that SB 624 creates an alternative test. He said Kansas Bar Association has no objection to SB 624. He said that ten states have enacted similar legislation. The Uniform Laws Commission requested the bill. Committee discussion followed.

Rep. Rock moved to amend SB359 into SB 624. Rep. Scott seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Rep. Vancrum moved to report SB 624 as amended favorably for passage. Rep. Rock seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Rep. Garner moved to approve committee meeting minutes from two April 30 committee meetings. Rep. Carmody seconded the motion. Motion carried.
