The House Legislative, Judicial and Congressional Reapportionment committee was called to order by Representative Joan Adam, Chairperson, at 10:55 p.m., Thursday, February 20th, 1992, at the rail. A quorum was present.

The purpose of the meeting was to introduce a technical change in HB 3083 regarding a change in Pottawatomie County. It has been requested that one township in Pottawatomie be shifted, township 0400, Lone Tree, population 266, from District 63 to District 61. (Attachment 1) Under this change the variance of both District 63 and District 61 would decrease.

A motion was made by Representative Reardon to reconsider HB 3083, seconded by Representative Snowbarger and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Representative Grotewiel to approve this technical change; seconded by Representative Garner and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Representative Grotewiel and seconded by Representative Roe to introduce HB 3083 as amended. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:05 a.m.
