The Chair called for action on \underline{SB} $\underline{542}$ - concerning air contaminant emission sources.

Senator Martin moved to adopted the amendments suggested in the balloon copy of SB 542 that was discussed by John Irwin at the meeting on March 5, 1992. Senator Langworthy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Senator Martin moved to recommend SB 542 as amended for passage. Senator Lee seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Discussion and action was called for on SB 678 - enacting the Kansas underground utility damage prevention act; concerning prevention of damage to certain underground utility facilities.

After discussion, and by agreement of the parties that made the conceptually motions on 3-5-1992 the action was rescinded.

Ed Schaub was called on to explain just how the one-call system worked and how the 800 number calls were handled in the evenings, weekends, and holidays.

Senator Martin moved to conceptually amend SB 678 on page 1 in the definition of notification center, to make it clear it was to be one center, and a statewide communication system. On page 2, in line 1, by striking "who" in line 2, by striking all before the period in line 39. by striking "three" and inserting "two", and on page 3, Sec. 5, the appropriate language be inserted here to make it clear there is one notification center. Senator Frahm seconded the motion. Motion carried. Senator Frahm moved the bill be passed as amended. Senator Langworthy seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Senator Sallee moved the minutes of March 4, 1992 be adopted. Senator Langworthy seconded the motion. Motion carried.
