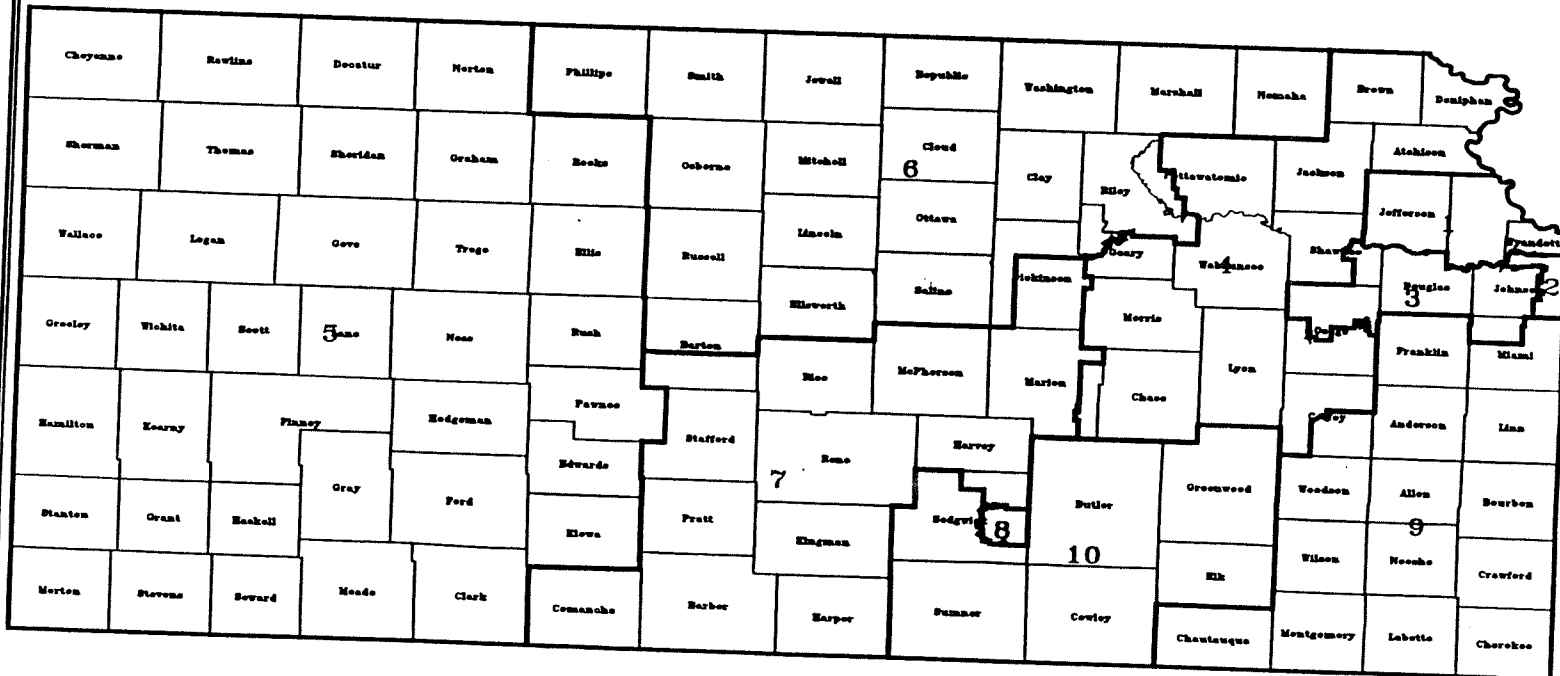
Meeting adjourned at 4:30.

district size 4.24%

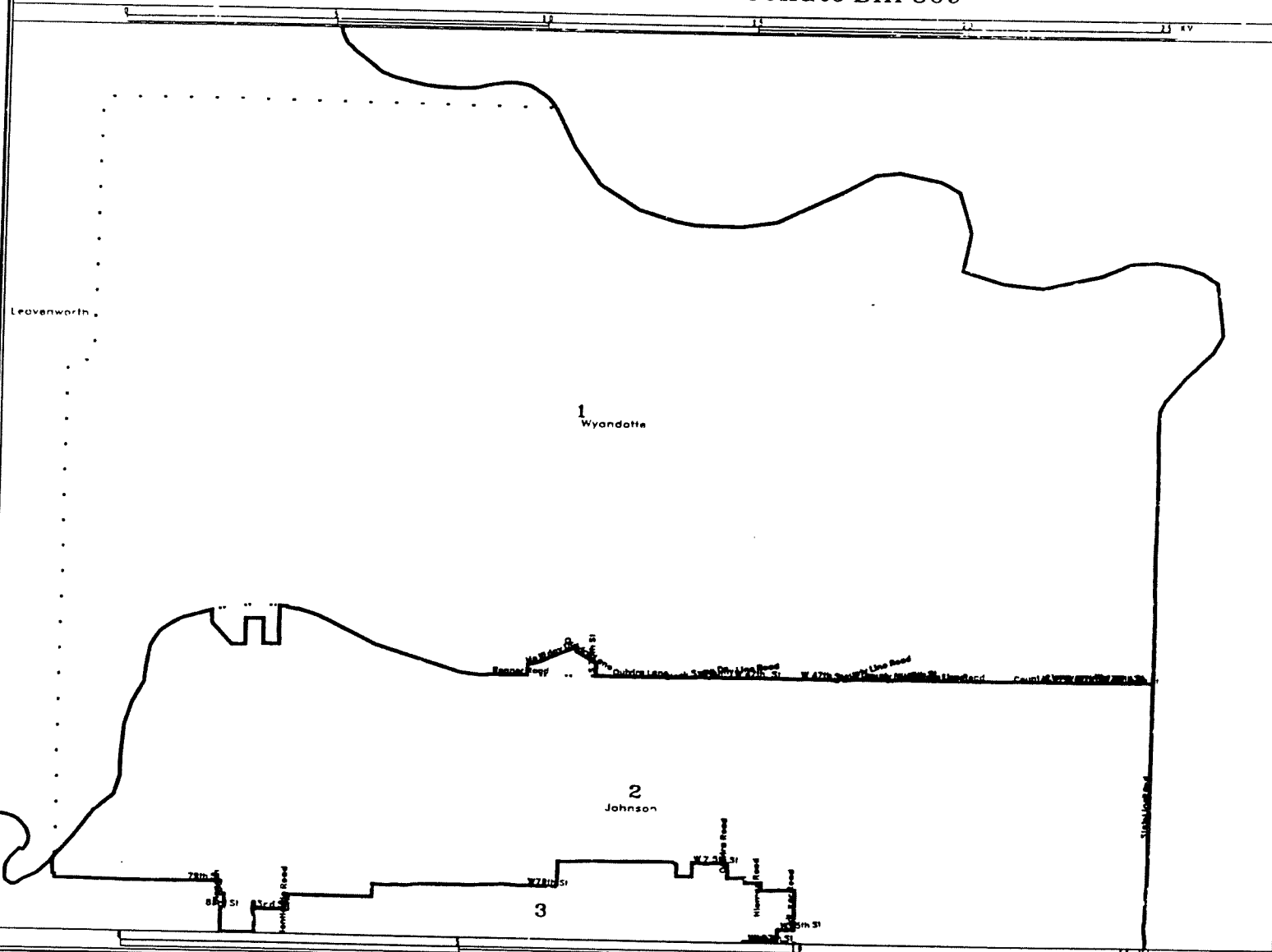

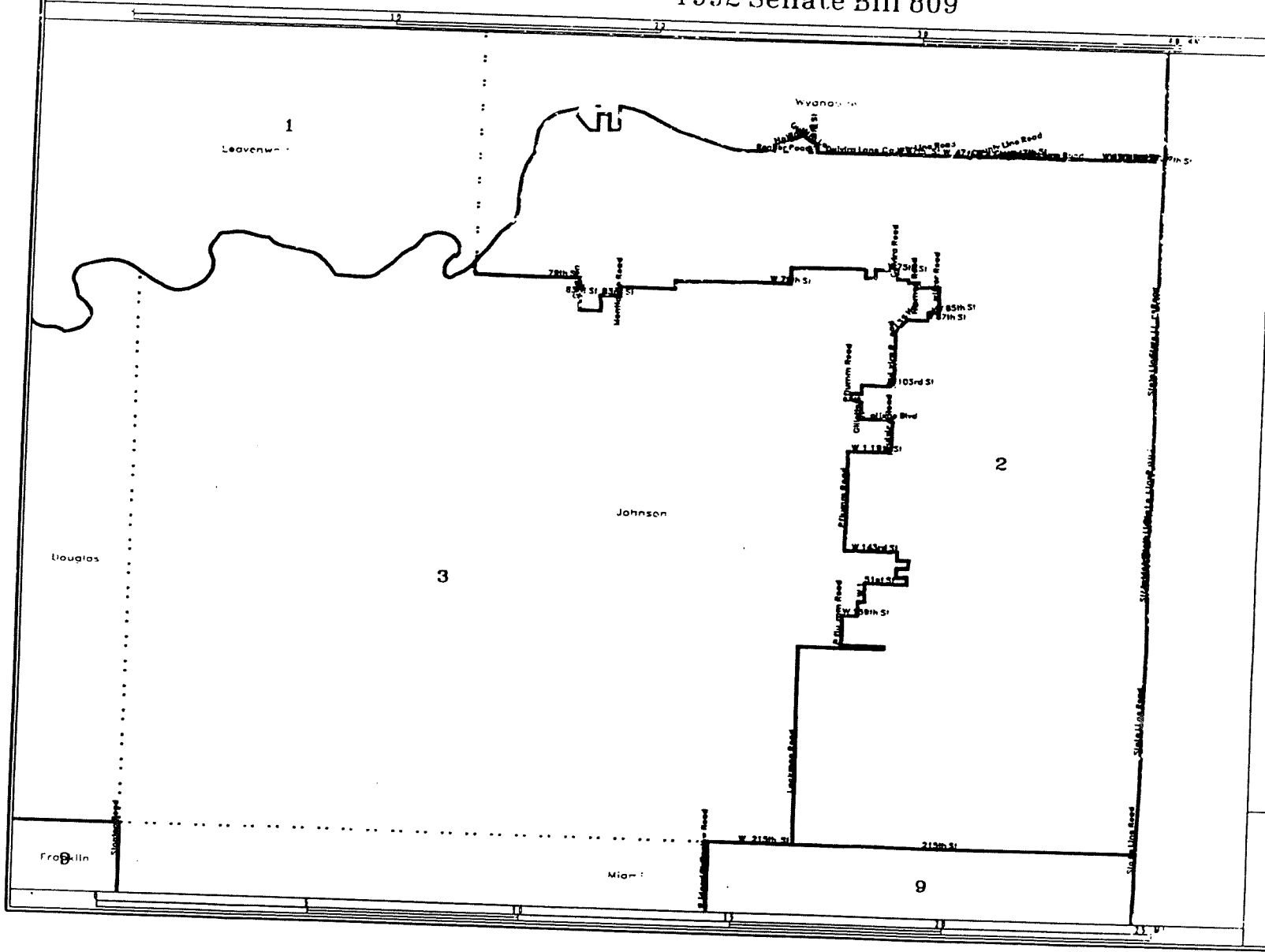

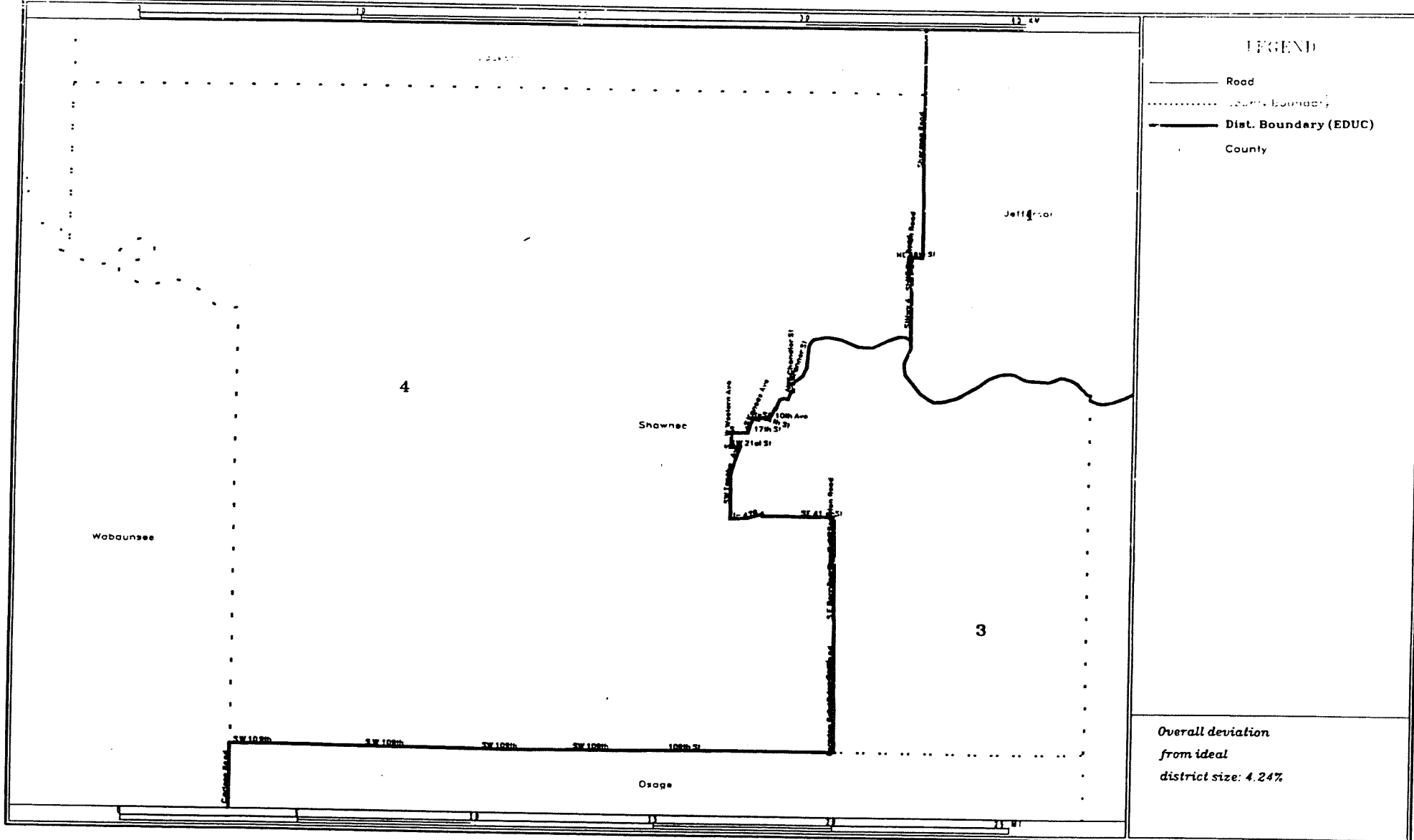

Shawnee County State Board of Education Districts 1992 Senate Bill 809



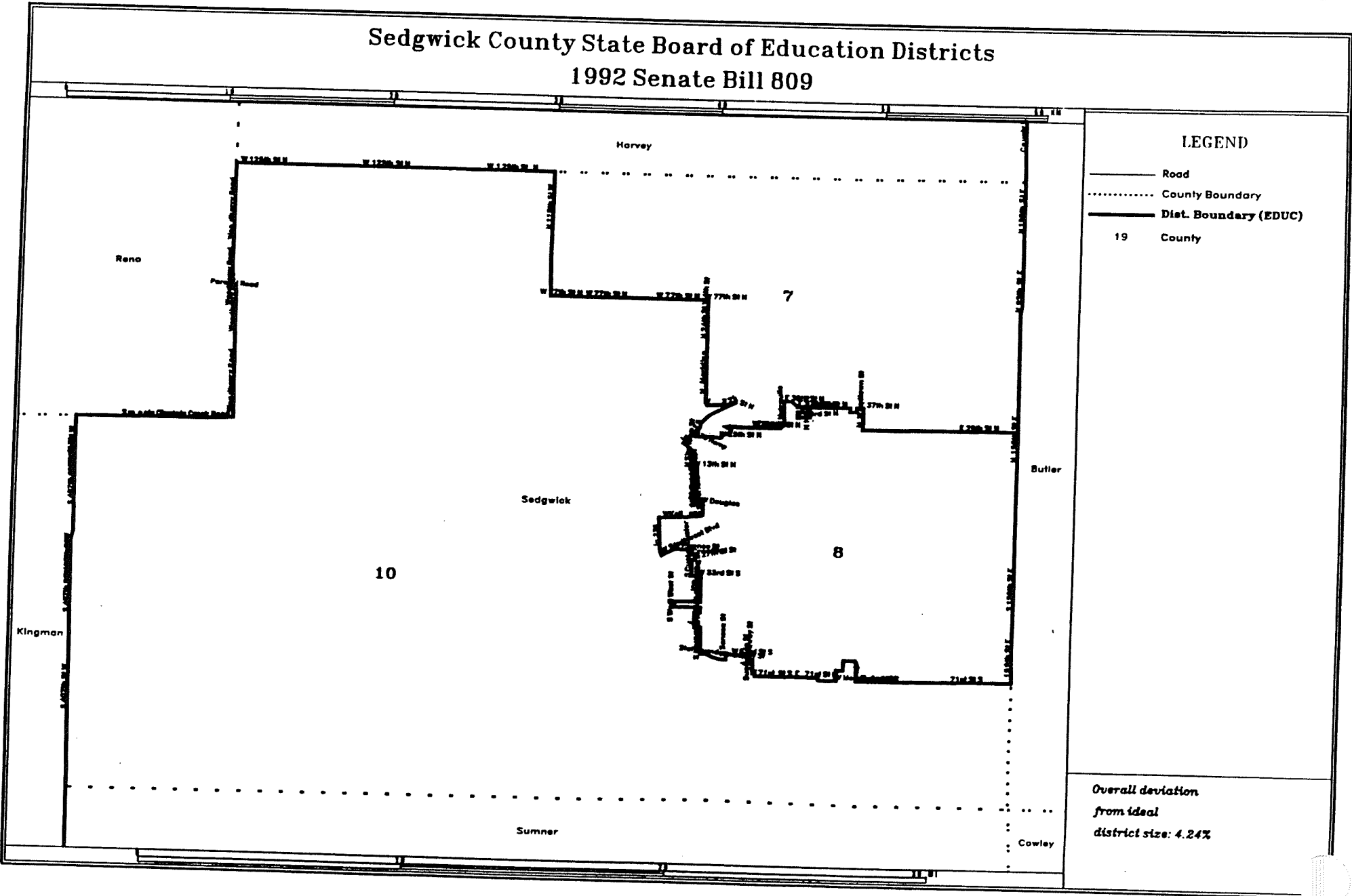

SENATE BILL No. 810

8 AN ACT concerning the Kansas Statutes Annotated; amending
9 K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 77-138 and 77-165 and repealing the existing
10 sections.
11

12 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

13 Section 1. K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 77-138 is hereby amended to read
14 as follows: 77-138. (a) Volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated shall
15 be printed and bound by the director of printing and delivered to
16 the secretary of state who shall dispose of them as follows:

17 *First*, the secretary of state shall deposit in the supreme court law
18 library and in the state library such number of copies as the state
19 law librarian and the state librarian, respectively, shall request for
20 use in the law library and the state library, for the purposes of the
21 publication collection and depository system established under
22 K.S.A. 75-2566 and amendments thereto, and for the purpose of
23 making exchanges with the various states and territories, and the
24 secretary of state shall retain one set for the secretary's use in the
25 secretary's office.

26 *Second*, (1) the secretary of state shall distribute two complete
27 sets of the Kansas Statutes Annotated to each member of the leg-
28 islature at each regular session, one set of which shall have the
29 respective member's name printed thereon.

30 (2) *The secretary of state shall distribute to each former legislator*
31 *so requesting one copy of each replacement volume of the Kansas*
32 *Statutes Annotated distributed in the first four years following the*
33 *end of the former legislator's term of office.*

34 (3) The secretary of state shall distribute such number of com-
35 plete sets and individual volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated
36 (A) to the office of revisor of statutes as the revisor of statutes shall
37 request, (B) to the legislative research department as the director
38 of legislative research shall request, (C) to the division of post audit
39 as the post auditor shall request, (D) to the division of legislative
40 administrative services as the director of legislative administrative
41 services shall request, and (E) to the judicial branch of state gov-
42 ernment as the chief justice of the supreme court shall request.

43 ~~(3)~~ (4) The secretary of state shall distribute: (A) Two sets to

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each representative in congress and United States senator from the state of Kansas, upon request by such representative or senator; (B) one set each to the governor, lieutenant governor and attorney general; (C) to Washburn university school of law, the number of sets, not to exceed 60 sets, that the librarian of the school of law certifies to the secretary of state as necessary for the purpose of exchanging with other states and territories and to be kept in the library for the use of faculty and students of the university; (D) to the school of law of the university of Kansas, the number of sets, not to exceed 60 sets, that the librarian of the school of law certifies to the secretary of state as necessary for the purpose of exchanging with other states and territories and to be kept in the library for the use of faculty and students of the university; (E) to the clerk of the district court of the United States for the state of Kansas, the number of sets, not to exceed five sets, as are requested by such clerk; (F) one set to each county law library in the state, upon request by the librarian thereof; (G) to each county clerk, the number of sets requested by the county clerk, not to exceed seven sets, to be distributed not more than one set each to the county or district attorney, the county clerk, the county counselor, if any, the register of deeds, the sheriff, the county treasurer, and the board of county commissioners, which set shall be retained by the county clerk for use by such board; (H) not more than one set to each city of the third class, one set to each city of the second class and two sets to each city of the first class, upon request by the city clerk; and (I) one set to the state historical society library.

Third, the balance of statute books, after the above distribution shall be kept by the secretary of state for sale.

(b) The secretary of state shall sell each volume of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, including replacement volumes, at the per volume price fixed therefor by the legislative coordinating council under this section. General index volumes, when sold separately and not as a part of a set of cumulative supplements, shall be sold at the per volume price fixed therefor by the legislative coordinating council. The secretary of state shall remit all moneys received from such sales under this section to the state treasurer at least monthly and the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount of each such remittance in the state treasury to the credit of the state general fund.

(c) The legislative coordinating council shall fix the per volume price of each volume of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, including replacement volumes, sold under this section to recover the costs of printing and binding such volumes. The legislative coordinating

1 council shall revise such prices from time to time for the purposes
2 of covering and recovering such costs.

3 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 77-165 is hereby amended to read as
4 follows: 77-165. (a) Such number of copies of the cumulative sup-
5 plements for each volume of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, cor-
6 responding as nearly as possible in size and page with the current
7 bound volumes, as is specified by the revisor of statutes, subject to
8 available appropriations, shall be printed by the director of printing
9 and delivered to the secretary of state. Each year such number of
10 sets of the general index paperbound volume or volumes as is spec-
11 ified by the revisor of statutes, subject to available appropriations,
12 shall be printed by the director of printing and delivered to the
13 secretary of state. For purposes of this section the general index
14 paperbound volume or volumes shall be considered supplements.
15 The revisor of statutes, with the approval of the legislative coordi-
16 nating council, may provide for printing and delivery of additional
17 copies of supplements to volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated.

18 (b) The secretary of state shall dispose of full sets of supplements,
19 including the general index paperbound volume or volumes, as fol-
20 lows:

21 *First*, by delivering to all state officers, county officers and other
22 departments and officers the same number of sets and in the same
23 manner as provided by K.S.A. 77-138 and amendments thereto for
24 the distribution of volumes of the Kansas Statutes Annotated and,
25 by delivering to each member of the legislature three sets of such
26 supplements *and by delivery to each former legislator so requesting*
27 *one set of such supplements distributed in the first four years fol-*
28 *lowing the end of the legislator's term of office.*

29 *Second*, the balance of such supplements including as a part thereof
30 the general index paperbound volume or volumes, after such dis-
31 tribution, shall be kept by the secretary of state for sale. Supplements
32 for individual volumes except index volumes shall be sold at the per
33 volume price fixed therefor by the legislative coordinating council
34 under this section. Complete sets of cumulative supplements in-
35 cluding the general index volume shall be sold at the complete set
36 price fixed therefor by the legislative coordinating council under this
37 section.

38 (c) The secretary of state shall remit all moneys received from
39 the sale of supplements under this section to the state treasurer at
40 least monthly and the state treasurer shall deposit the entire amount
41 of each such remittance in the state treasury to the credit of the
42 state general fund.

43 (d) The legislative coordinating council shall fix the per volume

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1 and complete set prices of the cumulative supplements for the Kansas
2 Statutes Annotated sold under this section to recover the costs of
3 printing and binding such supplements. The legislative coordinating
4 council shall revise such prices from time to time for the purposes
5 of covering and recovering such costs.

6 Sec. 3. K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 77-138 and 77-165 are hereby
7 repealed.

8 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after
9 its publication in the statute book.

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
