## MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Bob Miller at 3:30 p.m. on February 14, 1995 in Room 423-S of the Capitol.

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 p.m. by the Chairperson Bob Miller. The minutes of February 13, 1995 were distributed and approved.

Belden Daniels addressed the committee regarding economic development issues for the United States as compared to other countries, what is happening in other states, what has happened in the past, and what should happen in the future. He said that Kansas Technology Enterprise Corporation has been the model for virtually all of the technology partnerships that have evolved over the last ten years. He also reported that there was too much emphasis put on programs and not enough on fundamental structural change that was going to leverage private sector dollars in a measurable way that was going to pay off in outcomes that can be measured at the local level, and be seen at the local level. The committee was told that all future plans have to be performance driven.
