## MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION.

Chairman King called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

Chairman King requested introduction of a bill involving consumer protection concerning health spas. Representative Dillon made a motion for the committee to introduce this bill, seconded by Representative Dawson and the motion carried.

The Chair opened HB 2118, an act regulating traffic; concerning the axle weight limitations on certain vehicles, for discussion and final action.

Representative Wilson offered an amendment making changes to Subsection (e) line 40 stating "any truck registered for a gross weight of 54,000 pounds or less transporting harvested grain or forage from a field of production to on-farm storage, local grain elevator or feedlot, as defined by K.S.A. 47-1501, and amendments thereto,." This was seconded by Representative Powell.

Representative McKinney offered a substitute motion adding a new subsection (f) that axles shall not exceed 34,000 pounds except on highways designated as part of the national system of interstate defense highways, trucks transporting harvested agricultural crops from a harvested field to initial storage or to initial market locations, shall be allowed to be loaded up to 10% in excess of the gross weight limitations prescribed by this section on any axle or tandem, triple or quad axles. This was seconded by Representative Flora. The motion failed.

Representative Dillon made a substitute motion to table HB 2118, seconded by Representative Long and the motion failed.

The Chair called for a vote on the original amendment by Representative Wilson and the motion carried.

Representative McKinney made a motion to amend subsection (e), (3) to state trucks transporting harvested agricultural crops only from a harvested field to initial market locations which are 30 miles or less from such field. This was seconded by Representative Dillon and the motion failed on a 7-8 vote.

Representative Shore made a motion to pass **HB** 2118, as amended, seconded by Representative Correll. The motion carried.

The Chair opened HB 2199, concerning owners of registered vehicle which unlawfully pass school buses, for discussion and final action.

Representative Dillon offered an amendment adding to line 10, "regulating traffic; increasing fine for illegally passing certain stopped buses; amending K.S.A. 1994 Supp. 8-2118 and repealing this section" and adding
