

MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dave Kerr at 1:30 p.m. on March 7, 1995 in Room 123-S of the Capitol.

Kansas Board of Regents Confirmation Hearings of Robert Talkington and Kenneth Havner. The Committee will not vote on the appointees until after the KBI checks have been completed.

Mr. Talkington presented his background and qualifications. He feels the Regents' most important goal is to continue to provide quality education at all levels. (See Attachment 1)

Senator Lawrence asked several questions of him. First, she wanted to know if he could represent all of the Regent institutions equally. He replied that he could, and that he considered doing so a primary requirement of the position. She asked what he felt is the greatest challenge for the Regents in the near future. He feels the greatest challenge is to maintain the current level of quality education, and to improve the level of quality in education to ensure America continues to be a world leader and globally competitive. She asked how he feels about qualified admissions. He replied it would be nice not to have them, but the Regents need to look at them because of the increasing costs of education.

Senator Downey asked him if perhaps the Regents need to look at setting goals for technical schools and colleges to guarantee placement for graduates. He replied that there needs to be continuing assessment of what is happening to students as they graduate to try to determine what the Regents could do to help graduates obtain jobs.

Senator Emert asked him how he feels about the duplication of courses and degrees among the universities and colleges. He replied that we don't need every degree program at every institution we have, but there needs to be some duplication between western Kansas and eastern Kansas to ensure everyone has reasonable access to education. The issue is to try to make the system more efficient while maintaining availability to all Kansans.

Senator Jones asked a follow-up question on qualified admissions. He asked what should be done with the students that could not qualify to attend a university. Mr. Talkington replied that community colleges and private institutions could be alternatives for those students. He agreed that there must be some avenue available for those students.

Chairman Kerr asked if he felt Washburn University should become a Regent institution, especially considering more money is given to their operating grant every year. He replied that due to funding constraints it would not be possible for Washburn to join the Regent system in the near future. However, at some point Washburn would certainly join the system. Chairman Kerr also asked him how he felt about Regent faculty and graduate assistants forming unions. He replied Kansas is a right to work state, and that sometimes unions are necessary. He hoped that the Regents would maintain a good relationship with the faculty and graduate assistants at the Regent schools so there would be no need for the unions. If this is not the case, then the Regents will have to work with the unions to resolve differences.

Mr. Havner presented his background and qualifications. He has been a supporter of Fort Hays State

University for 25 years because he believes in higher education. However, he can see a difference between having personal ties to Fort Hays versus the responsibility of a Regent to the citizens of the state of Kansas to fairly represent all Regent institutions. He feels he has ties to all the Regent schools. (See Attachment 2)

Senator Lawrence asked what he feels are the biggest challenges to the Regents. He feels the biggest challenge is the budget. She then asked what he feels is the role and goal of higher education in Kansas. He replied that the role of education is more than training students to specific jobs or degrees; education creates better people because better educated people with a greater knowledge of issues can be better citizens. She asked him how he feels about qualified admissions. He feels there should be some minimum requirement or qualifications to enter universities to prevent an unnecessary demand on the facilities. Those people who do not qualify would need another avenue such as community colleges and technical colleges to ensure they could receive training to become productive citizens.

Chairman Kerr asked him to consider the merits of a liberal arts education which has a value of learning for life versus training for a specific skill or job to enter the work force, and how budget funds should be allocated. Currently, technical schools and vocational technical schools are receiving a very small amount of funding. He replied that without knowing any of the budget numbers, it would be presumptuous of him to pretend he has a superior knowledge. Thus, he really couldn't answer the question. Chairman Kerr asked him as a Regent to give some consideration to post secondary training that would prepare students to enter the work force. He replied that there needs to be some recognition at the high school level that some people do not have the skills to attend a university. Currently, the curriculum in high school is geared toward all students attending college. This needs to be changed to encourage those students without the skills for college to obtain other useful job skills.

Senator Oleen asked him if he understand the time commitment required. He replied that he did indeed understand the amount of time that would be required.

A motion was made by Senator Emert to approve the minutes of the March 6, 1995 meeting. The motion was seconded by Senator Langworthy, and the motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:30 p.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for March 8, 1995.

REMARKS TO SENATE EDUCATION COMMITTEE

MARCH 7, 1995

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee:

I appreciate the opportunity to appear before you this afternoon concerning my confirmation as a member of the Kansas State Board of Regents. My name is Robert V. Talkington and I am a resident of Iola, Kansas. I am married to the former Donna Schmaus and we have five children and five grandchildren. All five of our children are graduates of Regent's Universities of the State of Kansas.

I was born and graduated from high school in Dallas County, Texas. I graduated from Tyler Junior College, Tyler, Texas, with an Associate of Arts Degree. I am also a graduate of the University of Kansas School of Education with a Bachelor of Science in Education and a graduate of the University of Kansas School of Law.

I served two years in the United States Army Counter Intelligence Corps, graduating from the Army Intelligence School at Fort Holabard, Maryland.

I have practiced law in Iola, Kansas, since June, 1956, when I was discharged from the Army. I served six years as County Attorney of Allen County, and am presently the Senior Partner of Talkington and Chase at Iola.

In 1968 I was elected to the Kansas House of Representatives and served there for four years. I was then elected to the Kansas State Senate. I served a total of sixteen years in the Senate holding the office of Vice President, Senate Majority Floor Leader and Senate President. I voluntarily retired from the Senate in January, 1989.

While in the Senate I served eight years as Chairman of the Transportation and Utilities Committee and as a result thereof served eight years on the Kansas Turnpike Authority. After I left the Senate Governor Hayden appointed me to another four year term on the Kansas Turnpike, and I served from 1989 to 1993.

I have always been interested in higher education and for that matter education at all levels. As I said before, our five children graduated from Regent's Universities here in Kansas so we also have a financial interest in the higher education system, but also I have appreciated the good education they received and how it has served them well in their careers. I hope to do what I can to assure that the quality of education in Kansas remains high.

If confirmed by this Senate for the Board of Regents I look forward to serving in that position. I think it will be a most interesting as well as enjoyable job. I will attempt to answer any questions the committee might have.

A statement prepared for presentation to the Senate Committee on Education concerning my qualifications to be a member of the Kansas Board of Regents.

- 1) I received all of my high school, college and legal education in Kansas.
- 2) I have maintained a law office in Hays, Kansas, for over 20 years.
- 3) I have actively supported Fort Hays State University for over 25 years, serving the University in a variety of ways:
 - a) President of Alumni Association;
 - b) Trustee of Fort Hays State University Endowment Association;
- 4) I received the opportunity to be a student at Fort Hays State University, Kansas University (graduate student) and Washburn University as law student.
 - a) I recognize the requirement of clearly defining the mission of each Regent's institution. It is imperative that each institution exhibit its ability to define and strive toward attainment of its unique mission statement.
- 5) The challenges facing the Regents institutions are multiple and complex.
 - a) The United States Congress and the Kansas legislature are reflective of the climate of the electorate - "No new taxes" - "fiscal responsibility" - "frugal budgets."
 - b) The Regents institutions must respond and will respond in a like manner.
 - c) I had the unique opportunity to serve as a legislative intern while a graduate student serving for the chairman of the Senate ways and means committee during the budgetary process. Although this occurred many years ago, it gave me an insight to the legislative budgetary process.

- d) As a City Commissioner and Mayor of the City of Hays, I had the opportunity of shared governance as a commission member. As an elected official, I have had the difficult task of balancing the demand for goods and services with the power to tax and the responsibility of the elected officials to the constituency of fixed incomes versus the hue and cry for economic development from the business community.

- 6) Lastly, I have 2 children attending Kansas University (a senior and a freshman). They share with me the challenges and travails of being a student in the '90's. My eldest daughter has applied for admission to Kansas University Law School.

- 7) The Committee may have concerns about my close ties to Fort Hays State University, understanding the responsibility of the Board to the entire State of Kansas to govern 6 Regents institutions. As an attorney I am prepared, by education, training and experience, to discern the distinctions between professional responsibility and personal feelings. Being a spectator at an athletic event does rise to the same commitment as my responsibility to be equitable, diligent, and vigilant for the goals and mission of all six Regent schools and my duty to the people of the State of Kansas.
