MINUTES OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Al Ramirez at 1:30 p.m. on April 7, 1995 in Room 531-N of the Capitol.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Ramirez at 12:12 p.m. The agenda for the meeting was the confirmation hearings on Charles E. Simmons, Acting Secretary of Corrections; and Robert A. Wesley, Human Rights Commission.

Charles E. Simmons, Acting Secretary of Corrections, was present to give input as to his qualifications and experience which would qualify him for the position of Secretary of Corrections. Copies of his Statement of Substantial Interest and Appointments Questionnaire (Attachments 1 and 2) were distributed to the committee.

Mr. Simmons stated that he was pleased to have the opportunity to appear before the committee and was honored by the Governor's appointment. He is a native of Russell, Kansas, where he graduated from high school, attended Kansas State University, graduated from the Washburn University law school in 1976, and began his career in corrections at that time. His first job was as an attorney for legal services for the prisoners. With an office inside the walls of the penitentiary, he served as a representative for the inmates of the Kansas State Penitentiary and the Kansas Correctional Institution for Women. The job entailed a wide variety of different issues affecting the inmates. In 1979 he was asked to be the legal advisor and counsel for the Kansas State Penitentiary and the Kansas Correctional Institution for Women. In 1981 he transferred to a staff attorney position in Topeka. In February 1983 Secretary Michael Barbara asked him to be chief counsel for the department and he has held this position for twelve years. Last August, Governor Finney asked him to serve as acting Secretary when Secretary Stotts resigned. He agreed to do so. Governor Graves asked him to remain in that position when he became Governor in January. A couple of days ago, the Governor asked him if he would serve as Secretary and he agreed to do so. He has had sixteen years with the Department of Corrections in senior management positions and has had the responsibility of being the acting Secretary of Corrections for nearly eight months. Mr. Simmons stated he has a management style that allows people to do their jobs. Some things will be done differently than have been done in past years, with safety being the primary concern. The effort will be to afford those individuals who are going back into society a better opportunity to succeed than when they came into the system, with programs and counseling to help achieve those results.

On a personal note, Mr. Simmons stated he has three children, ages sixteen, fourteen, and eight years of age. His wife works with Head Start in the Topeka school district.

Mr. Simmons was asked if he would have to give up the chief legal counsel position now. He replied, yes. He was also asked about the prison population and what will happen to relieve the burden of prisoners. He replied that there in the process of pursuing some expansion options that will increase bed capacity. In the last three months there has been a significant increase in the number of inmates into the system. Long-term projections are for the population to continue to increase.

In response to a question from one of the committee, Mr. Simmons stated that all people who commit felonies do not belong in prison; these individuals could be safely placed in a community setting with the proper sanctions. For those individuals who need to be in prison, the state needs to provide the resources and space. It is important not to jeopardize the public safety. He mentioned the policy decisions of the Legislature. If more people are going to go to prison, Corrections will have to have the resources to house them.

A situation where a prisoner escaped was mentioned. Mr. Simmons stated that it was a county decision to hold the prisoner at the jail; it was not because the prison did not have the space.

Mr. Simmons was asked about the SRS handling of the youth situation and discussion about establishing a separate youth offender program under the Department of Corrections. The response was that there are no contingency plans for taking over and operating the youth centers; the Department is not looking for new turf to take over. If the policy decision is made by the Legislature that the Department of Corrections is the appropriate agency to be responsible for the supervision of the youth centers, the first priority will be security and the safety of the public; anything subsequent to that will be secondary to that initial public safety responsibility. Not losing sight of changing the direction of these young people and of the rehabilitation aspects are clear opportunities with these juveniles.

Mr. Simmons responded to other questions concerning the prison area and ended his presentation.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Simmons and called on Robert A. Wesley, Human Rights Commission, who was also present to give his qualifications for the Human Rights Commission.

Mr. Wesley thanked the committee and distributed copies of his Statement of Substantial Interest and Appointments Questionnaire. (Attachments 3 and 4). Mr. Wesley has been with the Human Rights Commission since 1990, and has served until 1994. He was appointed by Governor Mike Hayden. He served during Governor Finney's length of office until just prior to her departure. Mr. Wesley stated he felt very humble to receive word from Governor Graves's office that he be appointed to serve again to the Human Rights Commission.

Mr. Wesley said the people on the Commission have done a remarkable job; the Commission has done a lot of things for the good of humankind. He is grateful to appear in front of the Committee for this job once again. He will do his very best to continue to see that fair treatment is given to every person. The Commission has worked very hard at this. He ended by thanking the committee for his appearance today.

Mr. Wesley was asked if he was aware of the legislation that would allow those who have filed cases after three hundred days to be able to go to the court system.

Mr. Wesley responded that he was in favor of any expedient method of reaching some cases that have not been addressed. It would reduce the backlog as the Commission gets one hundred-fifty cases a month as it now stands.

Mr. Wesley was asked if the Human Rights Commission was the umbrella for all the claims of minorities who have questions or whatever it might be and did he see the need for different organizations for every minority.

He responded that this had been talked about within the Commission. As they see it, these people have not approached the Commission to do anything for them. A minority such as the African American, is in favor of any group able to take care of what it applies for. However, the Human Rights Commission takes care of everything from disability to other areas. He stated the Commission does not proclaim knowledge of all things that go on in the state, but anything that comes before the Commission. He is not opposed to minority committees being organized. The Human Rights Commission is there for the purpose of Human Rights. They take all cases as they come to them.

Mr. Wesley was asked if he was on the Commission when the name was changed from the Civil Rights Commission to the Human Rights Commission. He responded that he was on the Commission then. He stated that they were not aware the change had been made. They were concerned about the name change without its coming directly from the Commission. They realized after that move was made that it somehow strengthened the Human Rights Commission in so far as the ability to handle all claims that came to them. The name change has been helpful to the Human Rights Commission because it is not classified as a one race organization. They did not author it, but it has been helpful. Mr. Wesley gave the geographical locations of the members, the makeup of the Commission and gave information concerning the meetings.

The Chairman thanked Mr. Wesley for his appearance.

Senator Reynolds moved that Charles Simmons be recommended for confirmation as Secretary of Corrections. Senator Gooch gave a second to the motion. The motion carried.

Senator Gooch moved that Robert Wesley be recommended for confirmation to the Human Rights Commission. Senator Harris gave a second to the motion. The motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned.




