Dear Senator Burke:

During the 1995 legislative session, the Senate Ways and Means Committee agreed to request interim studies on several subjects. The Committee requests that the Legislative Coordinating Council designate special committees to study each of the following proposals:

- 1) Regents Institutions -- review of the current method under which utility expenditures are funded as well as incentive plans for utility savings
- 2) Regents Institutions -- review the manner in which funding for Regents institutions is currently considered, especially tuition adjustments
- 3) Regents Institutions -- review the formula for the servicing of new buildings as it applies to both new and existing buildings
- 4) Regents Institutions -- study the enrollment adjustment mechanism, specifically multi-year rebasing and adjustments to the current enrollment adjustment mechanism and corridors
- 5) Regents Institutions -- review of issues of campus violence and

general risk management practices with an attempt at developing a statewide policy on risk management

- 6) Regents Institutions -- examination of the current statutes regarding the acquisition of property by Regents institutions, a review of state responsibility for maintenance with a view toward increasing the level of legislative oversight and developing a policy on the level of maintenance support to be provided by the SGF
- 7) KCC -- expenditures and revenues of the Conservation Fee Fund, particularly evaluation of the longterm condition of the fund
- 8) Department of Administration -- examine ways to better report revenue and expenditures in the nonreportable budget of the Department of Administration
- 9) University of Kansas Medical Center -- study of potential shortfall or revenues to the Medical Loan Repayment Fund and the development of possible options for program modification
- 10) Board of Regents -- review of the status of federal funding for student financial assistance and the possibility of merging other scholarship programs, such as the Kansas ethnic minority scholarship and ethnic minority fellowship programs
- 11) Department of Health and Environment --the growth in special project positions within the agency, why they are created, what oversight exists regarding their creation, and should other mechanisms be established to control their creation or continued existence
- 12) SRS -- Performance of the KanWork program -- Is training adequate? Is the program directed in the right way? Is the program properly funded?
- 13) SRS -- review of child support enforcement issues, including the concept of a central support payment center, the role of court trustee collections, the role of child support collections with other state agencies' collections efforts, and the possibility of the privatization of the state's collection efforts

- 14) SRS -- study the feasibility and desirability of shifting KanWork and related programs from SRS to the Department of Human Resources
- 15) Judicial Branch -- review of the role of the Judicial Branch in the determination of custody and residence of children in domestic relations proceedings
- 16) Judicial Branch -- review the issue of the Kansas Appellate Court caseloads, possible with assistance from the National Center for State Courts, to determine if the Legislature should limit the kinds of issues or cases that can be appealed
- 17) KBI -- review the issue of whether the KBI should seek reimbursement for services provided to other state agencies and law enforcement entities, the appropriate amounts of reimbursement and other related issues

The Committee further requests that the special committees make reports and recommendations to the 1996 session of the Legislature.
