

MINUTES OF THE HOUSE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Bill Mason at 3:30 p.m. on February 5, 1996 in Room 519-S of the Capitol.

Ben Barrett, Legislative Research Department explained the bills to be heard by the committee today. They were developed by Senator Tim Emert as a result of interim committee's study of paperwork requirements.

Chairman Mason opened the hearing on SB 389-concerning school districts, boundary changes of board member districts, state board notification not required. This bill amends current statute to eliminate unnecessary notification. No proponents or opponents were present. The hearing on SB 389 was closed.

Chairman Mason opened the hearing on SB 390-concerning school districts inventoried in cooperation with federal government statutory provisions repealed. There is no longer a federal program or funding so this statute is considered obsolete. There was no proponents or opponents. Closed the hearing on SB 390.

Chairman Mason opened the hearing on SB 391-concerning school district data processing centers, statutory provisions for cooperative operation repealed. There are no cooperative data processing centers and other statutes apply, if needed. There were no proponents or opponents present. Hearing on SB 391 was closed.

Chairman Mason opened the hearing on SB 392 -concerning school district building-based education plans, statutory provisions repealed. This bill repeals statutes for pilot project building-based education, partially funded by KNEA and the State in the late 80's. The program was modified in 1992 and could be replaced with an application for Excellence grant. No proponents or opponents were present. The hearing was closed on SB 392.

Representative Powers moved SB 389 be passed favorably with Representative O'Connor seconding. Motion carried.

Representative Reardon moved SB 390 be passed favorably and Representative Morrison seconded. Motion carried.

Representative Horst moved SB 391 be passed favorably and Representative Pettey seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Representative Larkin moved SB 392 be passed favorably and Representative Powers seconded. Motion carried.

Representative Toelkes moved for introduction of a committee bill concerning Forbes attention facility, Flint Hills job corp center and other juvenile detention facilities to add counting dates. Representative Ballard seconded. Motion carried.
