The meeting of the Governmental Organization Committee was called to order at 1:35 p.m. by Senator Ramirez, Chairman. The agenda for the meeting was:

SB 581--relating to the Legislative Coordinating Council; concerning the membership thereof.

There were no conferees. Committee discussion was held.

One of the members asked the history of the bill that came up with the 4 House, 3 Senate membership.

Fred Carman, Revisor, stated that he was here when the legislation was passed; it started out 3 House and 3 Senate, but soon changed to 4 House and 3 Senate because of the number of House members.

Julian Efird, Legislative Research, stated that at the time of the proposed legislation, the President of the Senate was also the Lieutenant Governor.

After making a few more comments, the Chairman called for action on the bill.

Senator Harris recommended SB 581 favorable for passage; Senator Steffes seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Senator Gooch moved to approve the minutes of the January 31, 1996 meeting. Senator Papay seconded the motion; the motion carried.
