Chairman Steve Lloyd called the meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. He welcomed Ronald Hammerschmidt, Director of the Division of Environment for the second day of staff briefing by that Division. Mr. Hammerschmidt introduced Ron Fox, Bureau Manager of the Bureau of District Operation.

The Chairman welcomed Mr. Fox to the committee. He discussed issues of concern to that bureau, Community Outreach, Division of Environment Entry Point, and Areas of Continuing Concerns. (See pages 39 thru 41 of Att 1 in January 14 minutes) Discussion and questions by the committee followed.

Mr. Hammerschmidt introduced Bill Bider, Director of Bureau of Waste Management. Chairman Lloyd welcomed Mr. Bider to the committee. He discussed major issues of concern to that Bureau, State Solid Waste Plan, Financial Assurance for Local Government, Supplemental Environmental Projects (SEPs), Small Landfill Issues, Local Solid Waste Planning, Public Education/"Kansas": Don't Spoil It" Campaign, and Waste Reduction and Recycling Grants. (See pages 25 thru 28 of Att 1 in January 14 minutes) He also distributed a group of five maps for the committee to review. (See Attachment 1) Discussion and questions followed.

Mr. Hammerschmidt introduced Larry Knoche, Bureau Director, Bureau of Environmental Remediation. The Chairman welcomed Mr. Knoche to the committee, he discussed issues of concern to that Bureau, Cherokee County Superfund Site, Trends of Environmental Contamination, State Water Plan Projects and Innovation Approach to Regionally Treat Contaminated Public Water Supply Wells. Chairman Lloyd thanked Ronald Hammerschmidt, James O'Connell, Secretary of Health and Environment, and their staff for appearing before the committee.

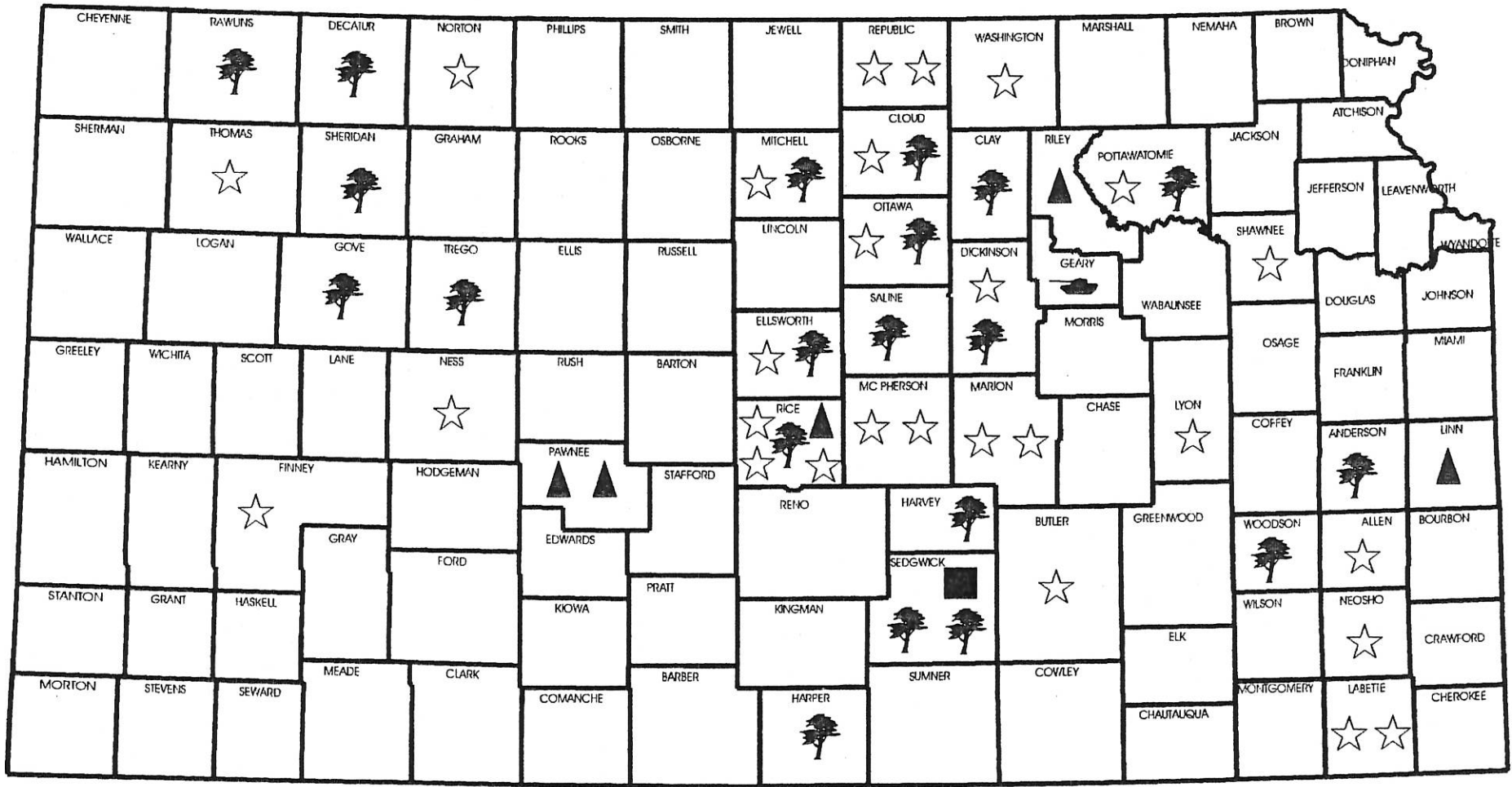
The Chairman called the committee's attention to a change in the agenda for January 16.

- 🌳 PERMIT REVIEW IN PROGRESS

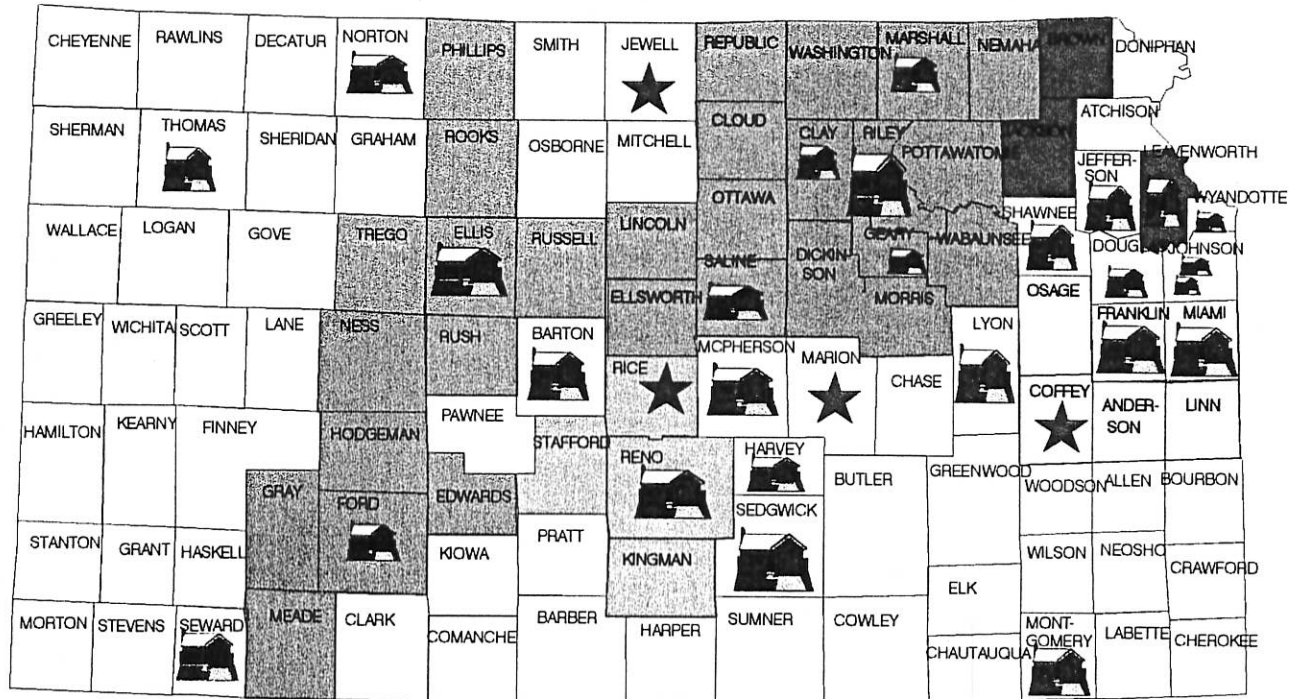

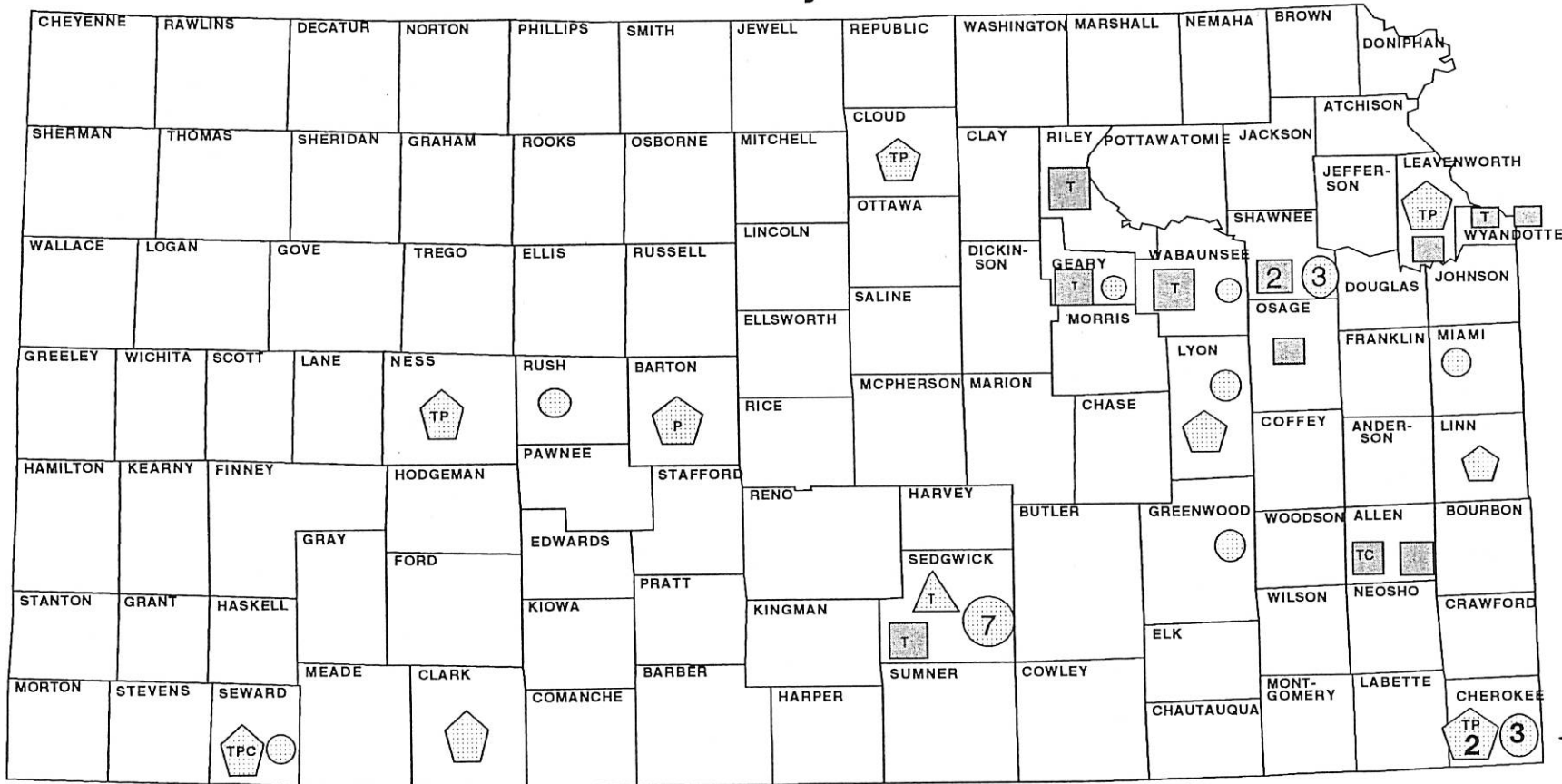

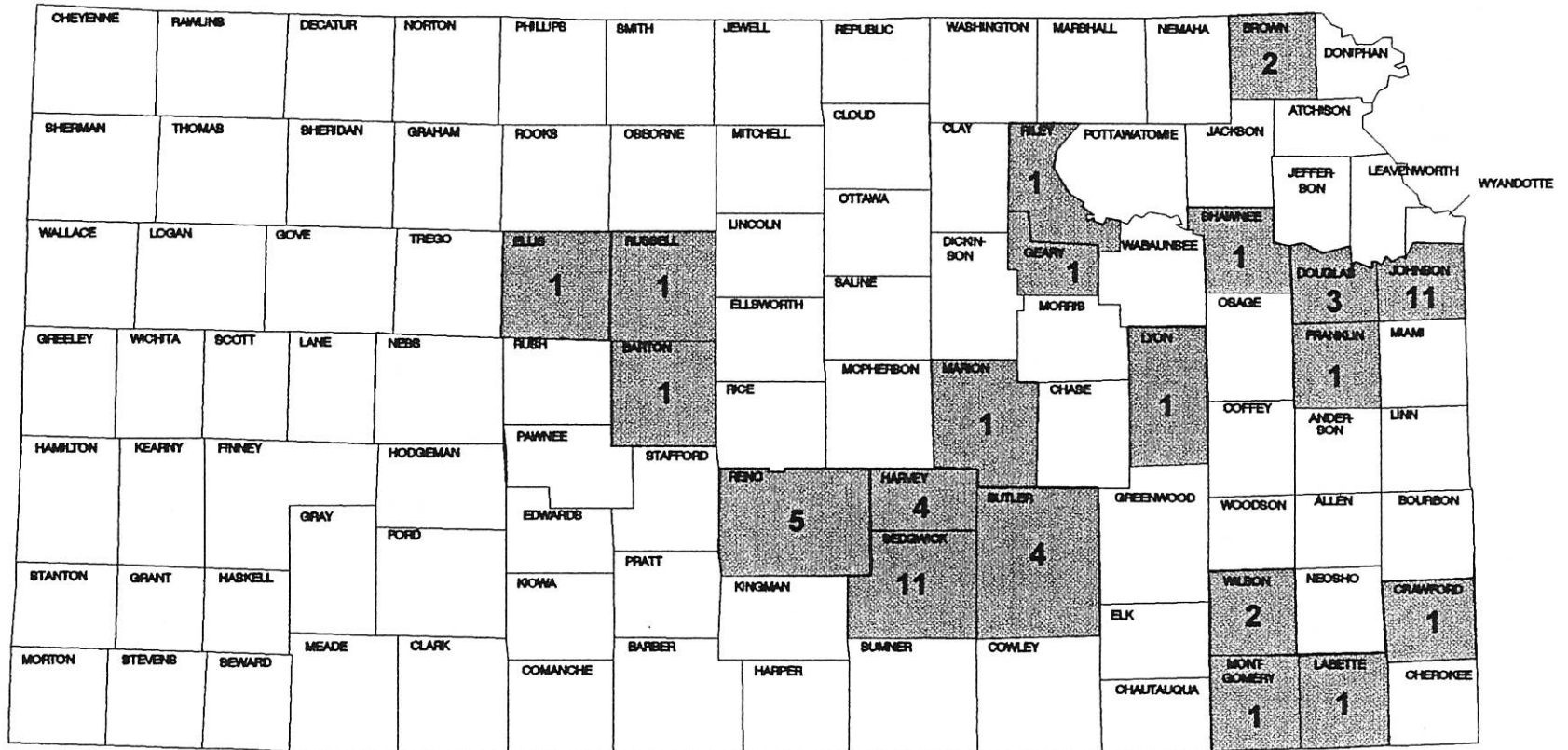

## September 1996



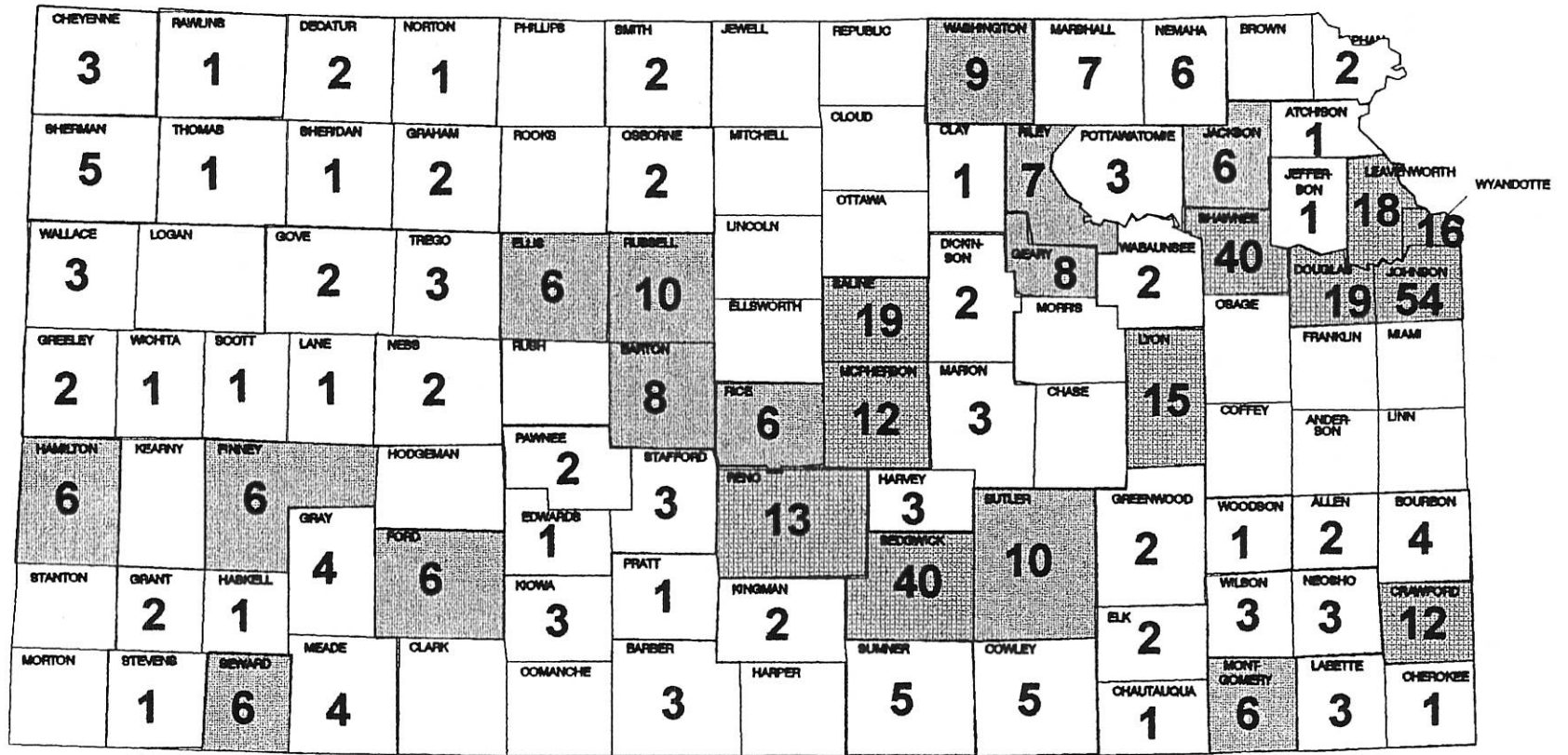
