Steve Rarrick, Deputy Attorney General, requested a Commerce Committee bill be introduced regarding telephone solicitations and telemarketing fraud. Mr. Rarrick stated the proposed legislation clarifies the definition of "consumer goods or services"; eliminates the exemption for companies who have an existing business relationship with the consumer; requires the caller to terminate the call at any time the consumer gives a negative response, not just when the caller asks permission in the first 30 seconds; and prohibits withholding or blocking caller ID or call-back by telemarketers.

Senator Barone moved, seconded by Senator Jordan, a Commerce Committee bill be introduced to: clarify the definition of "consumer goods or services"; eliminate the exemption for companies who have an existing business relationship with the consumer; require the caller to terminate the call at any time the consumer gives a negative response, not just when the caller asks permission in the first 30 seconds; and prohibit withholding or blocking caller ID or call-back by telemarketers. SB 59 Kansas river basin economic development; creation; powers and duties

The Chair asked if there was interest in working the bill. There was no response.

SB 83 Concerning the employment security law - recoupment of food stamp overissuance

Paul Bicknell, Chief of Contributions, Kansas Department of Human Resources, submitted a Memorandum providing answers to questions asked by Committee members. Mr. Bicknell stated only unemployment benefits that could be withheld are those from an adult food stamp household member that was a resident of the household during the time of the overissuance. Mr. Bicknell stated SRS, the food stamp agency, determines if there is an overissuance of food stamps by asking the applicant certain questions.

SB 83 is enabling legislation and can be utilized by the food stamp agency if it is determined to be cost effective.

Senate Bill 83

This memorandum is to provide you with answers to questions asked during the committee meeting on S.B. 83 on Tuesday, January 28, 1997.

Question:

If a member of a household is applying for U.I. benefits and was not a member of the household when the over issuance of food stamps was established, would

the Department be required to withhold benefits?

Answer:

No. The only benefits that could be withheld is from and adult food stamp household member that was a resident during the time of the over issuance.

Question:

How would the Department know whether there was an over issuance of food

stamps?

Answer:

This will be determined by SRS, the food stamp agency. This is another tool that SRS has available with this enabling legislation. If they choose to use the U.I. deduction the U.I. benefit recipient would be asked a question as to whether there exits a food stamp over issuance - based upon that response, the Department

may deduct for an over issuance.

Both SRS and DHR are in the process of trying to determine what the cost of this effort might be. Since the cost is not known at this time, I am unable to provide the cost of withholding to you.

Representatives from both SRS and DHR will be available for any further questions tomorrow, January 29, 1997, at the committee meeting.
