Representative David Adkins continued his presentation on the Juvenile Justice System. His information consisted of a list of community planning issues which he feels will exist with the Juvenile Justice System in Kansas. (Attachment # 1). The second handout is the way the new Juvenile Justice System will have to flow. (Attachment # 2)

Chairman Kejr announced that we would like to work through some of the philosophy of HB 2506 today. The first issue was the transfer date specifically the youth centers. After much discussion, the general consensus of the committee was that the transition date should be from July 1, 1997 to January 1, 1998. There will be a monthly report to the oversight committee created in HB 2520 by the commissioner. The commissioner will be forming a specific plan with outcomes and goals for community programs that will include expectations of the planning process and how the planning project or the programs will actually work. The commissioner will be responsible for all functions January 1, 1998 unless upon confer ring with the oversight committee, an extension is granted.

There was also lengthy discussion on the community programs for the Juvenile Justice System.

The next meeting is scheduled for April 1, 1997.

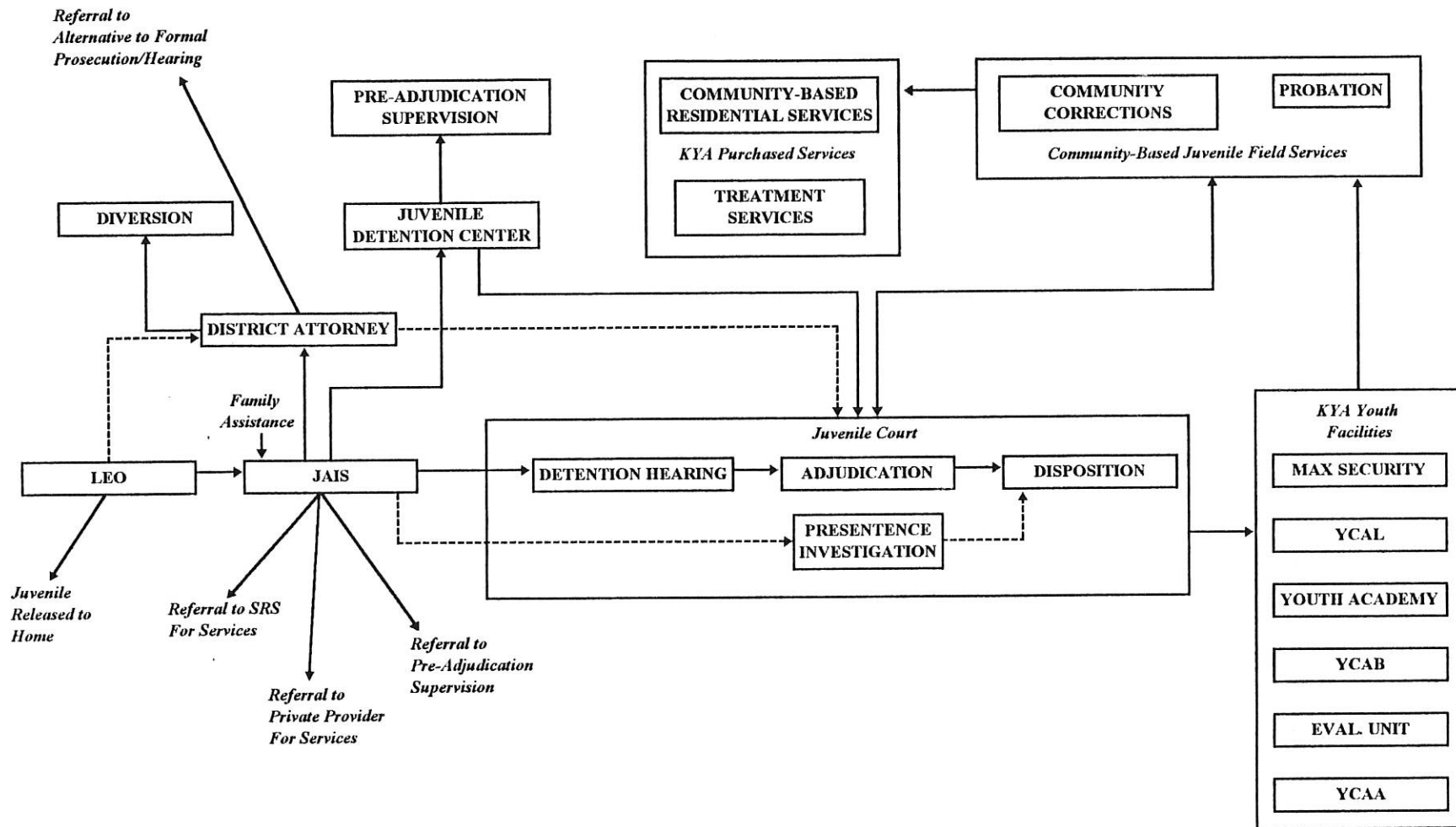
