Chairman Hardenburger opened hearing on SCR 1614 concerning the plan of the United States census bureau to use statistical sampling in the decennial census.

Mary Galligan, Legislative Research, explained the Concurrent Resolution to the Committee. She explained that the resolved section of the Resolution would call on the Bureau of the Census to conduct the 2000 decennial as an actual headcount of the population and bars the use of statistical sampling to create, or in any way adjust the count as mandated by a U. S. Supreme Court ruling. This would allow the state to receive unadjusted figures that are not subject to sampling for redistricting. Also urges Congress to make sure that census are conducted fairly and legally.

The Committee discussed any situations that are not covered in the Resolution that would effect the federal government's allocation of dollars to the state.

Chairman Hardenburger informed the Committee that this Resolution repeats the bill recently passed out of Committee.

Chairman Hardenburger closed hearing on the Resolution.

Senator Praeger moved that the Resolution be passed out favorably, seconded by Senator Becker. Motion carried.
