
Budget Highlights

Here's a summary of issues affecting the 2000-01 budget:

- The general fund budget was divided into 19 programs areas. Committees of community members and district staff developed budget priorities for each program area.
- This budget was built on the basis of no increase in K-12 enrollment. The Legislature increased the statewide allocation per student by \$50 to \$3,820. This resulted in a \$2.6 million general fund increase. An additional \$600,000 was included for expanded four-year-old and bilingual programs. A \$2.8 million increase in the local option budget—also known as the supplemental general fund—was funded by growth in district assessed valuation.
- In April 2000, the community approved a 20-year, \$284.5 million bond issue to air
 condition all schools, eliminate most portables, replace five schools, build two new
 schools, add 19 multi-purpose rooms, nine libraries, and upgrade science labs and
 building infrastructure throughout the district. Twenty-one percent of the principle and
 interest payments will be funded by the state while 79 percent will be funded by a local
 tax levy.
- The district's total mill levy including the bond issue payments for 2000-01 will be 46.2 mills or \$485 per year on a \$100,000 house.
- To reach our community's adult learners, the district focused on several unique programs. The Night School fund increased about \$524,620. This increase includes expansion of the Urban League program and the new Towne East Mall learning center slated to open this fall. Both programs offer evening instruction targeted to adults who dropped out of high school, but who now want to earn a diploma. State aid and local donations of more than \$300,000 will help fund the projects.
- To provide services to parents of elementary homeschool students, the general fund budget includes about \$200,000 to start a new electronic school—or "eSchool."
 Ongoing costs for this program will be funded by the state.
- The capital outlay fund increased by \$3 million to include Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) money which will be used to construct "safe" rooms to protect students in the event of a storm.
- The special education fund was increased by \$4 million to provide services to the district's growing special needs student population.


WHERE WE GET OUR MONEY

Kansas schools are funded with a mixture of federal, state and local taxes. The state funds about 67 percent of the Wichita Public Schools' budget while local taxes account for about a quarter of the schools' budget. Less than five percent of the district's money comes from the federal level.

How We Spend Our Money

The largest expenditure the district makes is on salaries and benefits which account for about 73 percent of budgeted expenses. The district also contracts with the Edison Partnership, Inc. to manage four of its schools and included in its contract expenses are funds for Edison staff salaries.

Combining district salaries and Edison salaries, the district spends about 76 percent of its budget on salaries and benefits.

The district has five broad categories that account for how the district spends its money. About three quarters of the district's budget is spent on instruction. As the chart to the left shows, the Wichita Schools keep instruction as its top budget priority while providing the funds necessary to the areas that support instruction. Even in the operations category, there are significant costs that directly support classroom instruction such as transportation, food service, utilities and custodial services.






Wichita Holds the Line On Homeowner Property Taxes




Wichita property taxes compare favorably when stacked up to neighboring districts. Wichita homeowners pay among the lowest school taxes compared to their counterparts in surrounding districts. The amount of taxes billed on a \$100,000 Wichita home went from \$1,082 in 1991 to its current rate of \$485— a drop of nearly 55 percent.






School Taxes Decrease



For years, the school district taxed more than the city and county. However, that trend has changed. While the city and county have consistently increased their taxes over time, the Wichita Public Schools have decreased its taxes. Simply put, over the last 10 years school district tax revenues decreased 43 percent; city tax revenues have increased 41 percent; and county tax revenues have increased 69 percent.




Wichita Mill Levy Remains Low



Since 1992 when Kansas changed how schools were funded, the Wichita mill levy has dropped and remained low. To make up for lost revenue from the state's general fund mill levy which was dramatically cut in 1992, the state allowed districts to levy a tax for the supplemental general fund which is commonly referred to as the local option budget or LOB. Unlike most of its counterpart districts statewide, Wichita has not levied its full capacity of the LOB. Instead, Wichita has kept its LOB levy steady over the past eight years. Due to the passage of the facility bond issue, the 2000 mill rate will increase, but still remains well below the last 10-year average.




Enrollment Holds Steady for Six Consecutive Years



The Wichita Public Schools' student enrollment continues to increase slightly. This includes an increase in the district's special education population which typically requires more financial resources than its general education counterparts. And since 1995-96, the number of students qualifying for free or reduced price lunch has increased 7 percent which now represents 48 percent of the total student population.




Wichita Schools Stack Up Favorably Compared to Neighbors and Peers




WICHITA SPENDS LESS PER STUDENT THAN ITS COUNTERPARTS





Wichita Students Improve on District Tests



The Wichita Public Schools take academic student performance seriously. To get the most accurate gauge of how well students are learning what is taught in its classrooms, the district developed a set of rigorous standardized tests called Benchmark Assessments. These tests measure student performance against the district's curriculum standards. Since 1997-98, second grade students have improved in all subjects tested—reading, writing and math.

The Wichita Public Schools are among the very few districts nationwide to undertake such a strenuous local testing program. Today more fifth graders are meeting the high academic standard set by the Board of Education as compared to when the tests were first given in 1997-98.






As Wichita teachers learn more specific information about student performance through these difficult tests, they develop targeted teaching strategies to address areas of weakness. As a result, Wichita teachers have created unique programs and the district offers summer school and tutoring, which help all students reach higher academic levels of performance. The most recent test results show a higher percentage of eighth-graders meeting the performance standard as compared to the results from 1997-98.




Wichita Students Top National Average on Tests






Wichita Public Schools Take Customer Satisfaction Seriously
