

MINUTES OF THE HOUSE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE.

Chairman O'Neal announced that the committee would be receiving a State of the District Courts by Judge Nancy Parrish. She commented that all courts in the state face the same problem, budget cuts. This effects the non-judicial personnel which are essential to keeping the courts running smoothly.

Caseloads continue to increase but the staff has not and therefore the courts are not keeping up with the caseload. One example was the protection from stalking petitions have risen since July 2002 to 1,000. The Protection from Abuse petitions have also increased, both due to the new law that took effect July 1, 2002.

The committee requested information on how the lack of funding and increased caseloads have affected the turnaround time of civil filings.

Chairman O'Neal appointed a sub-committee on **HB 2032 - Amendments to the Kansas Eminent Domain Act**: Representative Patterson, Chairman; Yoder, Goering, Pauls, Crow.

Representative Long made the motion to approve the committee minutes from January 15, 2003. Representative Pauls seconded the motion. The motion carried.
