Electric Prices in Kansas

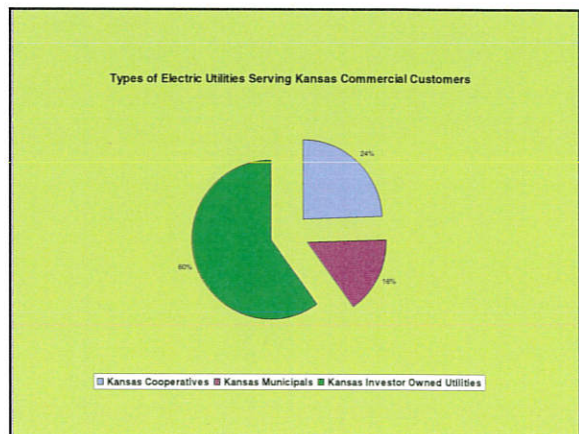
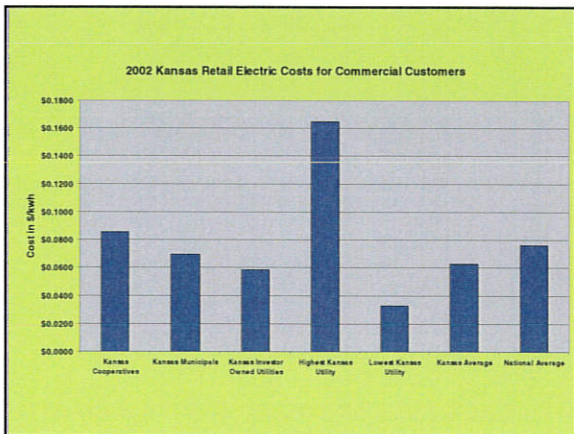
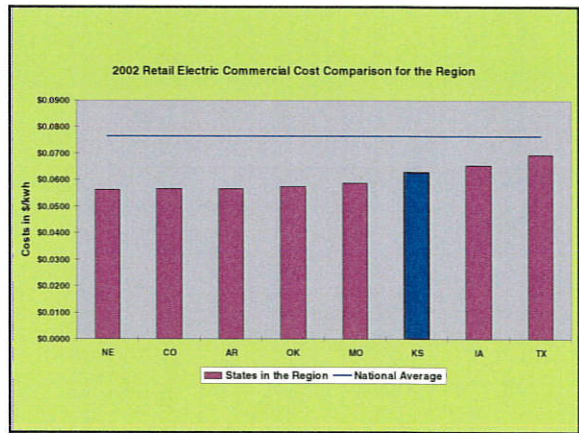
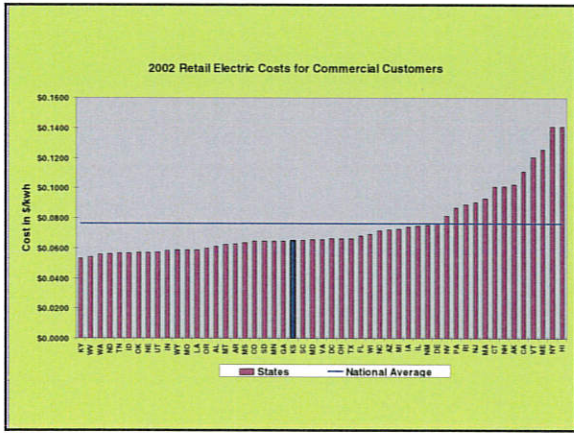
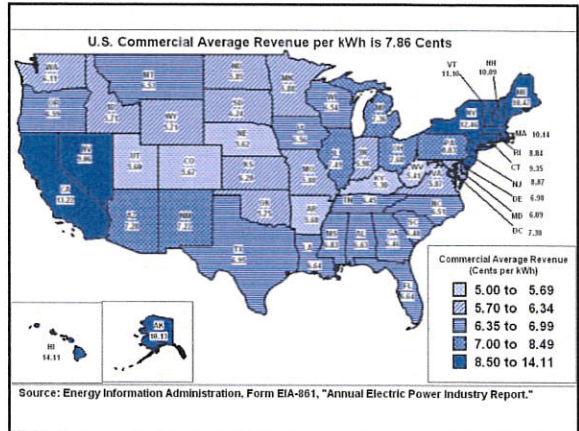
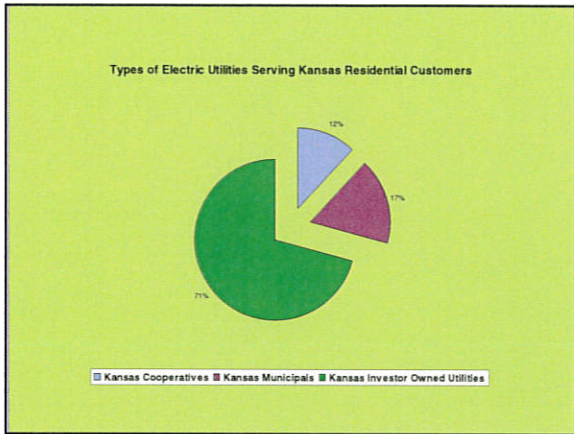
