

MINUTES OF THE HOUSE CORRECTIONS & JUVENILE JUSTICE COMMITTEE

The joint meeting with House Public Safety Budget Committee went on a tour of the Lansing Correctional Facility on January 20, 2005.

Warden David R. McKune, met the group and provided information on the facility. The Lansing Correctional Facility is the largest and oldest facility for detention and rehabilitation of male adult felons. The facility was established in 1864 and 1875 housed 379 inmates and 26 security officers.

The present capacity of Lansing Correctional Facility is 2,489.

- Maximum Facility - 1038 inmates
- Minimum Facility - 628 inmates
- Medium Facility - 743 inmates
- Osawatomie Facility - 80 inmates (located at Osawatomie State Hospital)

Staffing:

- 708 State employees of which 531 are uniformed corrections officers
- 301 contract employees
