**Rebecca W. Crotty, State Board of Tax Appeals**

Melissa Gregory, Director of Appointments for Governor Sebelius, introduced Ms. Crotty, noting that she would answer any questions the Committee may have concerning her appointment. A copy of Ms. Crotty's Senate confirmation summary was distributed to Committee members. (Attachment 1)

Senator Lee made a motion for Senate approval of Ms. Crotty's appointment to the Board of Tax Appeals, seconded by Senator Goodwin. The motion carried.

**Hearing on:**

**SB 195 - Concerning the disposition of seized firearms**

Secretary Wagon appeared before the Committee in support of **SB 195**. Secretary Wagon stated **SB 195** would give the Department the flexibility to transfer seized weapons to:

- 1) The Kansas State Historical Society if the weapons have historical value
- 2) The Secretary of KDWP to be used in hunter safety training
- 3) The KBI
- 4) Local law enforcement where the weapon was seized

As part of the transfer process, the weapon will be appraised, and the taxpayer will be notified of the appraised value, which is credited toward the taxpayer's tax liability. Secretary Wagon stated KDOR had the support of the local law enforcement on **SB 195**.

Mike Hayden, Secretary of KDWP, presented testimony in support of **SB 195**. Secretary Hayden stated KDWP feels that many of the firearms could be used within the hunter education program for live fire exercises, or permanently disabled for use as training aids for classrooms and safety scenarios. Phil Wilkes, Attorney, KDOR, handed out to the Committee the Kansas Drug Tax Assessment & Collection Statistics from FY88 through FY04 (Attachment 3), and a copy of the guns seized prior to 2004 (Attachment 4). Mr. Wilkes stood available for questions from the Committee.

In September 2004, I was confirmed by Senate committee to fill the unexpired term on the Kansas Board of Tax Appeals of David Patton, who resigned in May 2004. Since then I have served as a Board Member hearing tax appeals. I have also completed one of the required courses on property tax law as required by K.S.A. 74-2433. My short tenure on the Board has been interesting and informative and I am hopeful that I will be able to continue my service on the Board by being confirmed for a full term.

From 1999 to my interim appointment to the Board of Tax Appeals, I served as a district magistrate judge in Finney County where I heard mostly civil cases on a daily basis. This experience assisted me in understanding the importance of being an impartial arbiter careful to avoid being predisposed on those cases which I am charged to hear and decide. This judicial experience with respect to maintaining impartiality has been instructive for this position on the Board of Tax Appeals which is charged with the responsibility of resolving disputes regarding tax issues in accordance with the Constitution and the statutes in an equal and uniform manner.

I am an attorney licensed to practice in the State of Kansas in good standing continuously for the last 27 years. My practice involved a wide variety of matters including highly regulated areas. In addition to my judicial experience and private legal practice, I worked for some 14 years in the banking industry and developed expertise in all legal aspects of that highly regulated area. I am also experienced with analysis of financial data and financial statements through my experience as a loan officer and head of the loan review department during my banking tenure. Banking has further heightened my understanding of the interests of businesses and individual taxpayers as well as the interest of government in funding its activities. Conflicts between these interests should be resolved by a careful determination of the intent of the legislature, unless there are intervening Constitutional considerations. As a volunteer, I have maintained my analytical skills through service on the Garden City Community College Board and Finance Committee and the Finance Committee of St. Catherine Hospital in Garden City.



Senate Bill 195 prescribes certain procedures to be followed when the Kansas Department of Revenue seizes and disposes of firearms. The provisions contained in this bill would be effective on July 1, 2005. The Department of Wildlife and Parks supports the implementation of this bill.

The Department of Wildlife and Parks has a strong interest in the disposition of firearms possessed by the KDOR. The KDWP, among its many missions, is the agency charged with educating hunters in safe gun handling skills. As such, accidents involving the use of firearms when hunting are at all time lows within the State of Kansas and it is due to the success of the hunter education program.

Having reviewed the firearms possessed by the KDOR, the KDWP feels that many of those firearms could be used within the hunter education program for live fire exercises or permanently disabled for use as training aids for classrooms and safety scenarios. Using these firearms within the hunter education program would be a wise alternative use to the State continuing to store these seized firearms in perpetuity.

In summation, the KDWP would urge the committee to consider favorable passage of the bill.
