The meeting was called to order by Chairman Kathe Decker at 9:00 A.M. on March 17, 2006 in Room 313-S of the Capitol.

Copies of Estimated At-risk studies were distributed to the Committee by Dale Dennis. (Attachments 1, 2, 3 and 4).

A motion was made by Representative DeCastro and seconded by Representative Crow to reconsider the amendment to adopt Representative Merrick's at-risk definition.

Following a period of questions and answers, the motion passed.

Representative Decker made a motion asking for the uniform recording of at-risk. Representative O'Neal seconded the motion. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Representative O'Neal referred to the amendment to **HB 2986** in Section 26. (Attachment 5)

A motion was made by Representative O'Neal and seconded by Representative Crow to make this amendment by extending for another year, the cap of 6% that had been increased from 4% to 6% last year. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Representative DeCastro moved that all school districts would be required to provide a disclosure clause of all assets. Representative Gordon seconded the motion. The motion was later withdrawn.

The Committee recessed at 10:30 a.m. They will reconvene at 2:30 p.m.

The Chair called the Committee to order at 2:40 p.m.

A motion was made by Representative Merrick and seconded by Representative Gordon to amend by changing the definition of at-risk. The motion failed on a voice vote.

Representative Merrick offered another proposed amendment. (Attachment 6).

It was moved by Representative Merrick and seconded by Representative Gordon to move this amendment to **HB 2986**. The motion passed by a show of hands.

Representatives Crow, Flaharty and Phelps wished to be recorded as nay votes.

Representative O'Neal made a conceptual motion to amend **HB 2986** by striking the increased weights as well as all base changes for years 2 and 3. Representative Hayzlett seconded the motion which passed on a voice vote.

Representatives Crow, Flaharty and Phelps wished to be recorded as nay votes.

Representative O'Neal moved for the placement of the provision in New Section 28 to amend **HB 2986**. The motion was seconded by Representative Hayzlett and carried on a voice vote.

Representatives Crow, Flaharty and Phelps wished to be recorded as nay votes.

The Chair told the Committee that since so many changes had been made in the bill, perhaps they needed to do a substitute bill where they could see all the changes that had been made.

Representative Gordon moved that a substitute bill be made to **HB 2986**. Representative Merrick seconded the motion which passed by a voice vote.

A motion was made by Representative O'Neal and seconded by Representative Merrick to move substitute bill to **HB 2986** out of Committee. The motion carried on a voice vote.

Representatives Crow, Flaharty and Phelps wished to be recorded as nay votes.

The Chair spoke of the resolution (5rs2286), introduced by the Committee regarding the request of the House of Representative to the State Board to not adopt the federal mandate of 100% proficiency by the 2014 deadline. (Attachment 7).

A motion was made by Representative Decker and seconded by Representative O'Neal to pass this resolution out of Committee. The motion passed on a voice vote.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:00 p.m. There are no more meetings of the Select Committee on School Finance scheduled at this time.

Sec. 26. K.S.A. 2005 Supp.. 72-6426 is hereby amended to read as follows: 72-6416. (a) There is hereby established in every district a fund which shall be called the contingency reserve fund. Such fund shall consist of all moneys deposited therein or transferred thereto according to law. The fund shall be maintained for payment of expenses of a district attributable to financial contingencies as determined by the board. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b), at no time in any school year shall the amount maintained in the fund exceed an amount equal to 4% of the general fund budget of the district for the school year.

(b) (1) In any school year, if the amount in the contingency reserve fund of a district is in excess of the amount authorized under subsection (a) to be maintained in the fund, and if such excess amount is the result of a reduction in the general fund budget of the district for the school year because of a decrease in enrollment, the district may maintain the excess amount in the fund until depletion of such excess amount by expenditure from the fund for the purposes thereof.

(2) Except as provided in paragraph (1) of this subsection, at no time in school year ~~2005-2006~~ 2006-2007, shall the amount maintained in the fund exceed an amount equal to 6% of the general fund budget of the district for such school year.

New Sec. 27. Subject to the limitations for appropriations therefor, the 10 districts above 100.0 on the salary index contained in Cost Study Analysis of Elementary and Secondary Education in Kansas: Estimating the costs of K-12 Education (January 2006) reported by the legislative division of post audit shall be eligible for a grant of moneys to enhance teacher salaries in an amount to be determined by the state board of education in accordance with the recommendations of such cost analysis study.

New Sec. 28 . The provisions of this act shall not be severable. If any provision of this act is held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the entire act shall be null and void.

Also on page 18, by striking all in lines 5 and 6 and inserting:

Sec. 29. The provisions of this act relating to changes which occur after school year 2006-2007 shall become effective after the on and after its publication in the statute book and on the date of the issuance by the Kansas Supreme Court of the mandate and dismissal of Ryan Montoy, et al. v. State of Kansas, et al., case no. 92,032. (This a conceptual amendment that would require the amendment of the various sections in the bill which provide for changes in school years 2007-2008 and 2008-2009.)

Proposed Amendment

In school year 2006-2007, reduce the density at-risk weighting from .1 to .054;
(fiscal impact: reduces revenue by \$10,000,000)

Add definitions to K.S.A. 72-6407:

“Non-proficient pupil” means a pupil who is not eligible for free meals under the national school lunch act and who has scored less than proficient on the mathematics or reading state assessment during the preceding school year and who is enrolled in a district which maintains an approved proficiency assistance plan.

“Non-proficient pupil weighting” means an addend component assigned to enrollment of districts on the basis of enrollment of non-proficient pupils.

New Sec. . The non-proficient weighting of each district shall be determined by the state board as follows:

(a)(1) for school year 2006-2007, determine the number of pupils who took the mathematics or reading state assessments in school year 2004-2005 and (2) for school year 2007-2008 and each school year thereafter, determine the number of pupils who took the mathematics or reading state assessments in the preceding school year;

(b)(1) for school year 2006-2007, determine the number of pupils who scored below proficiency on either the mathematics or reading state assessments in school year 2004-2005 and (2) for school year 2007-2008 and each school year thereafter, determine the number of pupils who scored below proficiency on either the mathematics or reading state assessments in the preceding school year;

(c) divide the number determined under paragraph (b) by the number determined under paragraph (a);

(d) multiply the enrollment of the district by the dividend determined under paragraph (c);
and

(e) multiply the product determined under paragraph (d) by .068. The product is the non-proficient pupil weighting of the district.

(f) As used in this section, “pupil” means a pupil who does not qualify for free meals under the national school lunch act.

New Sec. (a) There is hereby established in every district a fund which shall be called the non-proficient pupil education fund, which fund shall consist of all moneys deposited therein or transferred thereto according to law. The expenses of a district directly attributable to providing assistance or programs to non-proficient pupils shall be paid from the non-proficient pupil education fund.

(b) Any balance remaining in the non-proficient pupil education fund at the end of the budget year shall be carried forward into the non-proficient pupil education fund for succeeding budget years. Such fund shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 79-2925 through 79-2937, and amendments thereto. In preparing the budget of such school district, the amounts credited to and the amount on hand in the non-proficient pupil education fund, and the amount expended therefrom shall be included in the annual budget for the information of the residents of the school district. Interest earned on the investment of moneys in any such fund shall be credited to that fund.

WHEREAS, The Kansas House of Representatives requests that the Kansas State Board of Education not adopt the federal mandate of 100% proficiency by the 2014 deadline. The Kansas House of Representatives requests that the Kansas State Board of Education create a mechanism of performance targets in reading, writing, mathematics, history, government and science that will help students achieve 100% of their potential. The Kansas House of Representatives commends the state board of education for unanimously voting to develop a student growth model; and

WHEREAS, The people of the state of Kansas believe in a quality education for every child. Kansas has maintained and will continue to maintain high expectations for its educational system. Act: Now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Kansas: That we urge the United States Department of Education, the Kansas State Board of Education and the Congress of the United States to address the issues contained in this resolution, and to make changes and permit flexibility that will ensure success for schools, teachers and students; and

Be it further resolved: That the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives provide an enrolled copy of this resolution to the President of the United States, the Secretary of the United States Department of Education, the President pro tempore of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, each member of the Kansas legislative delegation and the Chairperson of the Kansas State Board of Education.
