Moved by Representative Ruff, seconded by Representative Crow for approval of Minutes of the House Committee on Veterans, Military and Homeland Security held on February 12, 2007 be approved.

Motion carried.

Chairman Myers began working HB 2209 - Scholarships for military service in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Representative Goico presented a balloon for the bill. (Attachment 1) Representative Goico requested that the Revisor, Art Griggs summarize the changes in the bill.

Representative Goico moved to accept the amendment to **HB 2209** as stated in the balloon, seconded by Representative Goyle.

Motion carried.

Representative Goico motioned to move **HB 2209** as amended favorably for passage, seconded by Representative Goyle.

Motion carried.

Chairman Myers began working HB 2140 - English official language of the State of Kansas.

Chairman Myers recognized Representative Ruff to explain amendments to <u>HB 2140</u> as worked on by Representative Ruff and Representative Goico. They establish English as the "official" language of Kansas as well as the "common" language. She stated that this does not infringe upon the Native American population and their means of communication. Representative Ruff stated that they have taken out the language on "standing" which seems to be the difficult section with regards to other states and legal issues. She believes the amendments show flexibility, with the bottom line being to have English as the official language of Kansas.

Representative Ruff moved, seconded by Representative Goico to accept the amendment to **HB 2140** as stated in the balloon. (Attachment 2)

Representative Goico stated that they will be providing adult education to people wanting to learn English which is referred to in section 6. He stated how for him, learning English has made all the difference in his life.

Representative Goyle referred to his parents and how he only speaks "American." His concern is how we can have Kansans learn English as quickly as possible.

Representative Johnson stated that he doesn't understand what the bill does or the need for it. He questioned the Kansas seal and the non English language on it. Representative Ruff responded that this bill does not effect that.

Representative Light had concerns regarding section 6 wondering if it accomplishes anything more than what has been happening for the past 20 years as far as offering opportunities to learn English.

Representative Goico stated that if adult education programs need additional funding thru appropriations this bill may assist them.

Representative Phelps shared of the emphasis in the House Education Committee on English as a second language and programs throughout the state to assist people in learning English. With this in mind he questioned the need for the bill.

Representative Myers stated that he sees the need to be able to improve and increase the workforce in the State of Kansas. He shared that we are in need of a skilled workforce that can communicate in a common language. He considers this bill to be a pro-immigration bill, so that those not proficient in English can become so. He does not believe that this bill is taking away from anyone's first language but rather encouraging others to learn the common language of the State of Kansas.

Moved by Representative Ruff, seconded by Representative Goyle to move bill favorably for passage as amended.

Chairman Myers began working **HB 2425 - Tuition and fees for members of Kansas army or national guard.**

Representative Goico presented background on the bill and moved to amend **HB 2425** as described in the balloon. (Attachment 3) Seconded by Representative Colloton.

Motion carried.

Moved by Representative Goico to move **HB 2425** as amended favorable for passage, seconded by Representative Colloton.

Motion carried.

HOUSE BILL No. 2209

By Committee on Veterans, Military, and Homeland Security

AN ACT relating to military service; concerning tuition and fees of Kansas educational institutions; amending K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 75-4364 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 75-4364 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-4364. (a) As used in this section:

- (1) "Kansas educational institution" means and includes area vocational schools, area vocational-technical schools, community colleges, the municipal university, state educational institutions, and technical colleges.
- (2) "Public safety officer" means a law enforcement officer or a fire-fighter or an emergency medical services attendant.
- (3) "Law enforcement officer" means a person who by virtue of office or public employment is vested by law with a duty to maintain public order or to make arrests for violation of the laws of the state of Kansas or ordinances of any municipality thereof or with a duty to maintain or assert custody or supervision over persons accused or convicted of crime, and includes wardens, superintendents, directors, security personnel, officers and employees of adult and juvenile correctional institutions, jails or other institutions or facilities for the detention of persons accused or convicted of crime, while acting within the scope of their authority.
- (4) "Firefighter" means a person who is: (1) Employed by any city, county, township or other political subdivision of the state and who is assigned to the fire department thereof and engaged in the fighting and extinguishment of fires and the protection of life and property therefrom; or (2) a volunteer member of a fire district, fire department or fire company.
- (5) "Emergency medical services attendant" means a first responder, emergency medical technician, emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-defibrillator or a mobile intensive care technician certified by the emergency medical services board pursuant to the statutory provisions contained in article 61 of chapter 65 of Kansas Statutes Annotated.
- (6) "Dependent" means (A) a birth child, adopted child or stepchild or (B) any child other than the foregoing who is actually dependent in

whole or in part on the individual and who is related to such individual by marriage or consanguinity.

(7) "State board" means the state board of regents.

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- (8) "Military service" means any active service in any armed service of the United States and any active state or federal service in the Kansas army or air national guard *or reserves*.
- (9) "Prisoner of war" means any person who was a resident of Kansas at the time the person entered service of the United States armed forces and who, while serving in the United States armed forces, has been declared to be a prisoner of war, as established by the United States secretary of defense, after January 1, 1960.
- (10) "Resident of Kansas" means a person who is a domiciliary resident as defined by K.S.A. 76-729, and amendments thereto.
- (11) "Spouse" means the spouse of a deceased public safety officer or deceased member of the military service who has not remarried.
- (b) Every Kansas educational institution shall provide for enrollment without charge of tuition or fees for: (1) Any dependent or spouse of a public safety officer who died as the result of injury sustained while performing duties as a public safety officer so long as such dependent or spouse is eligible; (2) any dependent or spouse of any resident of Kansas who died on or after September 11, 2001, while, and as a result of, serving in military service; and (3) any prisoner of war; and (4) any person tend graduated from high school in Kansas who has served in military service in Iraq or Afghanistan at least 90 days after September 11, 2001, and in military service in military service in Iraq or Afghanistan shall be eligible for enrollment at a Kansas educational institution without charge of tuition or fees for not to exceed 10 semesters of undergraduate instruction, or the equivalent thereof, at all such institutions.
- (c) Subject to appropriations therefor, any Kansas educational institution, at which enrollment, without charge of tuition or fees of a prisoner of war or a dependent or spouse is provided for under subsection (b), may file a claim with the state board for reimbursement of the amount of such tuition and fees. The state board shall include in its budget estimates pursuant to K.S.A. 75-3717, and amendments thereto, a request for appropriations to cover tuition and fee claims pursuant to this section. The state board shall be responsible for payment of reimbursements to Kansas educational institutions upon certification by each such institution of the amount of reimbursement to which entitled. Payments to Kansas educational institutions shall be made upon vouchers approved by the state board and upon warrants of the director of accounts and reports. Payments may be made by issuance of a single warrant to each Kansas educational institution at which one or more eligible dependents or

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spouses or prisoners of well are enrolled for the total amount of tuition and fees not charged for enrollment at that institution. The director of accounts and reports shall cause such warrant to be delivered to the Kansas educational institution at which any such eligible dependents or spouses or prisoners of war discontinues attendance before the end of any semester, after the Kansas educational institution has received payment under this subsection, the institution shall pay to the state the entire amount which such eligible dependent or spouse or prisoner of war would otherwise qualify to have refunded, not to exceed the amount of the payment made by the state in behalf of such dependent or spouse or prisoner of war for the semester. All amounts paid to the state by Kansas educational institutions under this subsection shall be deposited in the state treasury and credited to the state general fund.

(d) The state board shall adopt rules and regulations for administration of the provisions of this section and shall determine the qualification of persons as dependents and spouses of public safety officers or United States military personned and the eligibility of such persons for the benefits provided for under this section.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 75-4364 is hereby repealed.

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Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

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There is hereby created in the state treasury the tuition waiver fund to be administered by the state board. Upon certification to the director of accounts and reports by the chief executive officer of the state board, or such officer's designee, of amounts needed to pay claims pursuant to this section, the director of accounts and reports shall transfer the amount certified from the state general fund to the tuition waiver fund.

AN ACT designating English as the official language of the state of Kansas and concerning its use by state agencies and political or taxing subdivisions.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) English shall be designated as the official language of the state of Kansas.

- (b) The official language is designated as the language of any official public document or record and any official public meeting:
- (1) An official public document or record is any document officially compiled, published or recorded by the state including deeds, publicly probated wills records of births, deaths and marriages and any other document or record required to be kept open for public inspection pursuant to the open records act.
- (2) An official public meeting is any meeting required to be open pursuant to K.S.A. 75-4317 et seq., and amendments thereto.
- (c) Except as otherwise provided by law, no state agency or political or taxing subdivision of the state shall be required to provide any documents, information, literature or other written materials in any language other than English.
- Sec. 2. A state agency or political or taxing subdivision, or its officers or employees, may use a language other than the English language to:
- (a) Provide information orally to individuals in the course of delivering services to the general public;
 - (b) comply with federal law;
 - (c) protect the public health or safety;
- (d) protect the rights of parties and witnesses in a civil or criminal action in a court or in an administrative proceeding;
- (e) provide instruction in foreign and native American language courses;
- (f) provide instruction designed to aid students with limited English proficiency so they can make a timely transition to use of the English language in the public schools;

Nothing shall prohibit state agencies or political or taxing subdivisions from: (1) Publishing any official public document or record in languages other than English at their discretion, so long as the document or record is also published in English; or (2) permitting a person who does not speak English to speak or communicate at an official public meeting with the assistance of an interpreter.

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g) promote international commerce, trade or tourism; fand

(h) use terms of art or phrases from languages other than the English language in documents

Sec. 3. This act shall not be construed in any way to infringe upon the rights of citizens under the constitution of the state of Kansas or the constitution of the United States in the use of language in any private activity. No agency or officer of the state or any political or taxing subdivision of the state may place any restrictions or requirements regarding language usage in any business operating in the private sector other than official documents, forms, submissions or other communications directed to government agencies and officers, which communications shall be in the common language as recognized in this act.

Sec. 4. This act may not be construed in any way to limit the use of any other language by a tribal government of native Americans located in the state of Kansas. A school district and a tribe, by mutual agreement, may provide for the instruction of students that recognizes the cultural identity of native American children and promotes the use of a common language for communication.

Sec. 5. Any citizen of the state of Kansas has standing to bring an action against the state or a political or taxing subdivision of the state to enforce this act. The district court has jurisdiction to hear and decide any such action brought pursuant to this act.

Sec. 6. The provisions of this act are severable and any provision held invalid shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions of this act.

Sec. 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.

Nothing in this act shall diminish or expand any existing rights under the laws of Kansas or the United States relative to services or materials provided by the government of Kansas in any language other than English.

Sec. 6. The state of Kansas recognizes the importance of establishing and actively promoting English language classes, training, or other educational services for non-native speakers. The local entity designated by the Kansas state department of education to offer such services shall seek the assistance of local political subdivisions, community-based agencies and organizations, migrant worker groups, refugee resettlement programs, schools, churches, and others in making non-native speakers aware of the availability of such services and ensuring their continuation and expansion.

AN ACT concerning state educational institutions; relating to fees and tuition; amending K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 76-729 and repealing the existing section; also repealing K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 76-729a.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 76-729 is hereby amended to read as follows: 76-729. (a) Persons enrolling at the state educational institutions under the control and supervision of the state board of regents who, if such persons are adults, have been domiciliary residents of the state of Kansas or, if such persons are minors, whose parents have been domiciliary residents of the state of Kansas for at least 12 months prior to enrollment for any term or session at a state educational institution are residents for fee purposes. A person who has been a resident of the state of Kansas for fee purposes and who leaves the state of Kansas to become a resident of another state or country shall retain status as a resident of the state of Kansas for fee purposes if the person returns to domiciliary residency in the state of Kansas within 12 months of departure. All other persons are nonresidents of the state of Kansas for fee purposes.

- (b) The state board of regents may authorize the following persons, or any class or classes thereof, and their spouses and dependents to pay an amount equal to resident fees:
 - (1) Persons who are employees of a state educational institution;
 - (2) persons who are in military service;
- (3) persons who are domiciliary residents of the state, who were in active military service prior to becoming domiciliary residents of the state, who were present in the state for a period of not less than two years during their tenure in active military service, whose domiciliary residence was established in the state within 30 days of discharge or retirement from active military service under honorable conditions, but whose domiciliary residence was not timely enough established to meet the residence duration requirement of subsection (a);
 - (4) persons having special domestic relations circumstances;
- (5) persons who have lost their resident status within six months of enrollment;
 - (6) persons who are not domiciliary residents of the state, who have

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graduated from a high school accredited by the state board of education within six months of enrollment, who were domiciliary residents of the state at the time of graduation from high school or within 12 months prior to graduation from high school, and who are entitled to admission at a state educational institution pursuant to K.S.A. 72-116, and amendments thereto;

- (7) persons who are domiciliary residents of the state, whose domiciliary residence was established in the state for the purpose of accepting, upon recruitment by an employer, or retaining, upon transfer required by an employer, a position of full-time employment at a place of employment in Kansas, but the domiciliary residence of whom was not timely enough established to meet the residence duration requirement of subsection (a), and who are not otherwise eligible for authorization to pay an amount equal to resident fees under this subsection;
- (8) persons who have graduated from a high school accredited by the state board of education within six months of enrollment and who, at the time of graduation from such a high school or while enrolled and in attendance at such a high school prior to graduation therefrom, were dependents of a person in military service within the state; if the person, whose dependent is eligible for authorization to pay an amount equal to resident fees under this provision, does not establish domiciliary residence in the state upon retirement from military service, eligibility of the dependent for authorization to pay an amount equal to resident fees shall lapse; and
- (9) persons who have retired or have been honorably discharged from military service, had a permanent change of station order for active duty in Kansas during such military service and live in Kansas at the time of enrollment.
- (c) (1) The state board of regents shall authorize the following class of persons to pay an amount equal to resident fees: (1) Any dependent or spouse of a person in military service who is reassigned from Kansas to another duty station so long as such dependent or spouse continues to reside in Kansas. (2) So long as a person remains continuously enrolled, exclusive of summer sessions, a person who qualifies to pay resident fees by virtue of being a spouse or dependent of a person in military service shall not lose such status because of a divorce or the death of a spouse; and (2) any person who is a member of the Kansas national guard.
 - (d) As used in this section:

- (1) "Parents" means and includes natural parents, adoptive parents, stepparents, guardians and custodians.
- (2) "Guardian" has the meaning ascribed thereto by K.S.A. 59-3051, and amendments thereto.
 - (3) "Custodian" means a person, agency or association granted legal
