Moved by Representative Kelsey, seconded by Representative Ruff for approval of the Minutes of the House Committee on Veterans, Military and Homeland Security held February 4, 2008. Motion Carried.

Chairman Myers announced that February 13 is the last day for bill introductions by members. The last day for nonexempt committee bill introductions is February 15. There were none.

Hearings will be held the week of February 25 on <u>HB 2852 - Placing a security freeze on consumer reports for veterans and active duty service personnel</u>. The hearing date and date the hearing will be worked will be announced in the Agenda for the week of February 25 through February 29.

The Chairman recognized Rep. Ruff, who gave an overview of an amendment to HB 2663 - Relating
to veterans. The amendment clarifies that no veterans' service representative of the Kansas Commission on Veterans' Affairs shall take a power of attorney in the name of the Kansas Commission on Veterans Affairs. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit any such veterans' service representative from assisting any veteran with any claim in which a power of attorney is not required.

Rep. Ruff explained that veterans' service organizations are able to serve as power of attorney for veterans in claims situations. However, since the KCVA represents the state of Kansas, the state could be sued if the KCVA was acting as power of attorney and this amendment would limit the liability of the state.

Moved by Representative Ruff, seconded by Representative Goico to amend **HB 2663** per balloon by modifying page 1, line 9 by striking "K.S.A.73-1211" and line 10 of page 1 by striking "sections" and inserting "section"; striking lines 35 through 39 on page 2; and striking lines 15 through 29, modifying line 30 on page 3 by striking "K.S.A. 73-1211" and striking "are" and inserting "is" and by renumbering the remaining sections accordingly. Motion Carried (Attachment 1)

Discussion followed: Rep. Ruff explained that out of 30,000 claims filed for veterans only four or five have been represented by the KCVA with power of attorney in the name of the state of Kansas. Rep. Goico clarified that the federal government had suggested that states should not be acting as power of attorney.

HOUSE BILL No. 2663

AN ACT relating to veterans; amending K.S.A. 73-1211 and K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 73-1210a and repealing the existing sections.

section

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 73-1210a is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1210a. (a) Except as otherwise provided by law, and subject to the Kansas civil service act, the executive director of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall appoint such subordinate officers and employees, subject to the approval of the commission, as are necessary to enable the commission to exercise or perform its functions, powers and duties pursuant to the provisions of article 12 of chapter 73 of Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto.

(b) Upon the commencement of the interview process, every candidate for a position in a Kansas commission on veterans affairs office that interviews claimants and provides information advice and counseling to veterans, surviving spouses, their dependents concerning compensation, pension, education, vocational rehabilitation, insurance, hospitalization, outpatient care, home loans, housing, tax exemptions, burial benefits and other benefits to which they may be entitled, or any other sensitive position, as determined by the executive director shall be given a written notice that a criminal history records check is required. The Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall require such candidates to be fingerprinted and submit to a state and national criminal history record check. The fingerprints shall be used to identify the candidate and to determine whether the candidate has a record of criminal history in this state or another jurisdiction. The Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall submit the fingerprints to the Kansas bureau of investigation and the federal bureau of investigation for a state and national criminal history record check. Local and state law enforcement officers and agencies shall assist the Kansas commission on veterans affairs in taking and processing of fingerprints of candidates. If the criminal history record information reveals any conviction of crimes of dishonesty, or violence such conviction may be used to disqualify a candidate for any position within the Kansas commission on veterans affairs. If the criminal history record information is used to disqualify a candidate, the candidate shall be informed in writz2663h1.pdf

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ing of that decision.

- (c) Persons employed by the Kansas soldiers home and Kansas veterans home shall be excluded from the provisions of subsection (b). No person who has been employed by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs for five consecutive years immediately prior to the effective date of this act shall be subject to the provisions of subsection (b) while employed by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs.
- (d) All such subordinate officers and employees shall be within the classified service under the Kansas civil service act, shall perform such duties and exercise such powers as the Kansas commission on veterans affairs and the executive director of the commission may prescribe and such duties and powers as are designated by law, and shall act for and exercise the powers of the commission and the executive director to the extent authority to do so is delegated by such commission or director.
- (e) Except as otherwise provided by law, and subject to the Kansas civil service act, the executive director of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall appoint such subordinate officers and employees, subject to the approval of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs, as shall be necessary to enable the commission to exercise or perform its functions, powers and duties pursuant to the provisions of article 19 of chapter 76 of Kansas Statutes Annotated, and amendments thereto. All such subordinate officers and employees shall be within the classified service under the Kansas civil service act, shall perform such duties and exercise such powers as the commission, the executive director of the commission, the superintendent of the Kansas soldiers' home and the superintendent of the Kansas veterans' home may prescribe and such duties and powers as are designated by law, and shall act for and exercise the powers of the commission, the executive director of the commission, the superintendent of the Kansas soldiers' home and the superintendent of the Kansas veterans' home to the extent authority to do so is delegated by such commission, executive director or superintendent.
- (f) Any veterans service representative appointed by the executive director of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall be an honorably discharged veteran or retired from the United States armed forces. Employees of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall act as an agent with power of attorney for any claimant only if the power of attorney is taken in the name of a veterans service organization chartered by congress and recognized by the federal department on veterans affairs for claim representation.

Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to affect the status, rights or benefits of any officer or employee of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs employed by such commission on the effective date of this act.

No veterans service representative of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall take a power of attorney in the name of the Kansas commission on veterans affairs. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit any such veterans service representative from assisting any veteran with any claim in which a power of attorney is not required.

For the purpose of this subsection, "veterans service representative" means any officer or employee appointed pursuant to this section whose primary duties include:

- (1) Assisting and representing veterans and their dependents in securing benefits from the federal government and the state of Kansas.
- (2) Providing information and assistance to veterans and dependents in obtaining special services and benefits based on knowledge of federal and state laws, policies and regulations pertaining to veterans benefits and services.
- (3) Providing assistance to veterans service organizations participating in the veterans claims assistance program.
- (g) Nothing in this act shall be construed to affect the status, rights or benefits of any officer or employee of the Kansas veterans' commission employed by such commission on the effective date of this act.
- Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 73-1211 is hereby amended to read as follows: 73-1211. All claims filed with the federal veterans' administration by the Kansas veterans' commission shall be prosecuted by an accredited representative of one of the participating veterans' organizations department of veterans affairs by the Kansas commission on veterans affairs shall be prepared, presented and prosecuted by an accredited representative of a veterans service organization chartered by congress and recognized by the federal department on veterans affairs for claims representation. No employee of any veterans' organization shall participate in or receive any funds hereinafter appropriated or made available to the Kansas veterans' commission unless such employing veterans' organization shall prosecute any and all claims to the federal veterans' administration department of veterans affairs that are referred to them or their employees by the Kansas veterans' commission commission on veterans affairs.
- Sec. 3. K:S.A: 73-1211 and K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 73-1210a are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
