**Testimony before Senate Committee on Elections and Local Government
in Support of House Bill 2408
by Carol Williams, Executive Director
March 18, 2008**

House Bill 2408 amends K.S.A. 25-4148, which is a provision of the Campaign Finance Act. This bill is a recommendation that was made by the Governmental Ethics Commission for the past four years in its Annual Report and Recommendations.

The new language amending K.S.A. 25-4148 is found on pag 6 lines 3-22. Political action committees and party committees would be required to report the name and address of each candidate for state or local office that either receives an in-kind contribution or is identified in an independent expenditure made by the committee which expressly advocates for or against the named candidate. The amount, date, and a detailed description of the service would also be required to be disclosed.

Under current law, political action committees and party committees do not have to report the name of any candidate they make expenditures on behalf of when filing a receipts and expenditures report. Committees are currently required to list the vendor to whom the expenditure is made, not the candidate on whose behalf the expenditure is made. For example, if a political committee pays the postmaster \$1,000 for stamps which are donated in-kind to a candidate, the stated purpose on the report is stamps. If a company is paid \$75,000 to print and distribute independent mailings which benefit three specific candidates, the committee is only required to itemize the expenditure to the company (vendor) with the stated purpose "political flyers". The public has no idea after viewing this PAC's report that any specific candidate was the recipient of an in-kind contribution, or that the committee made independent expenditures that expressly advocated for the election or defeat of threes candidates.

Scanned copies of all PAC and some party committee reports are posted the same day

they are received on the Commission's web site for the public to view. To provide a better understanding of the dollars being spent to support or oppose Kansas candidates, the Commission believes that political action committees and party committees should be required to provide more detailed information concerning their efforts to influence political campaigns in Kansas.

The Commission urges your support of House Bill 2408.

Campaign Finance Reform

Today, I would like to make comments about HB 2408, and also discuss other issues related to campaign finance reform.

In general, the proposed HB 2408 changes would be welcome. The new detailed information on expenditures would give greater clarity to bundled expenditures by parties or PACs for a group of candidates.

Most PACs are conscientious in the preparation of their reports. However, some are not. I would expect PAC reports with larger contributions and expenditures to be subject to more scrutiny, but in at least one case this hasn't happened. I have concerns that new reporting requirements imposed by HB 2408 could be ignored by those choosing to do so, with possibly few or no consequences. Now, there doesn't seem to be any motivation to get a PAC report right the first time, since anything -- no matter how large the dollar amounts -- can be corrected by filing an amended report. Before this year, notices of Errors and Omissions for PACs have not been online, so the public doesn't know about problem reports. [Perhaps this will change this year with the new online page at the Ethics Commission's web site.] I will give examples later of reports that should have been amended, in my opinion, and have not.

HB 2408 only addresses a PAC or Party expenditure that "expressly advocates the nomination, election or defeat" of a candidate. But, what about the stealth "non-profits" that spent nearly \$450,000 in the two weeks before the Nov 2006 general election?

The Kansas non-profit "Progress Kansas" spent at least \$46,775 and sent out three negative "advocacy" mailings in the week before the Nov 7, 2006 election affecting about six State Rep races, including my district. The Secretary of State's Business Entity Search now shows the status of this non-profit corporation as "delinquent," since the group did not file the necessary renewal papers. This non-profit has not filed any papers with the IRS that can be viewed by the public -- the IRS refuses to comment on whether this group was a 501(c)4, 501(c)3, or something else under the IRS code. This group did NOT file either an IRS 8872 or IRS 990 report as a non-profit. Why are the citizens of the state left in the dark about a Kansas non-profit that was only active in the week before an election? Why are only two PACs from Missouri, and one PAC from Kansas allowed to know the players behind this non-profit, and their intent of the negative mailings in the week before the election?

The Kansas non-profit "Kansans for Consumer Privacy Protection" spent perhaps \$400,000 and sent out as many as six negative "advocacy" mailings, and perhaps made phone calls and sponsored radio

commercials, in the two weeks before the Nov 7, 2006 election. This non-profit also has not filed any papers with the IRS about its non-profit status that can be viewed by the public, and it's not clear if this group was a 501(c)4, 501(c)3, or something else under the IRS code. Why are the citizens of the state left in the dark about a Kansas non-profit that was only active in the two weeks before an election?

Shouldn't Kansas non-profit groups that are only active in the week or two before an election, and have no known status with the IRS as a non-profit, be required to file as a PAC so the citizens of the state know something about such groups? Why are "fly-by-night" Kansas non-profits, without an office, without an E-mail address, without a phone, without a public spokesperson, and who don't hold public meetings, be allowed to affect elections in such a stealth way?

Out of curiosity I have researched candidate, party and PAC reports for over five years. When I started I wanted to find out how big the "Kansas Political Pie" was, and what fraction various groups had in that pie. That's far easier said than done even after five years. In 2003 lists of the political players cost \$0.25/page and by 2004 cost \$0.50 page. Luckily, by early 2006 these lists and the many reports were put online for free. We are making progress, but there are still some problems to address, and some improvement that need to be made, including:

- More scrutiny of at least some PAC reports is necessary: Why is "best effort" acceptable for the occupation of large contributors 78 times in one report? Why is no purpose acceptable for a \$15,000 expenditure in the same report? Is tuition at Wichita State an acceptable PAC expenditure? ProKanDo filed such a report in Jan 2006.
- One Kansas PAC reported receiving a \$6250 contribution from the Young Democrats of America 527 PAC from Washington, DC in their July 2006 report. But that wasn't the whole story. For some reason, the Kansas PAC actually sent \$25,000 to YDA, and YDA two weeks later sent two checks for \$15,625 back to the Kansas PAC, according to IRS 8872 reports. I informed the Ethics Commission about this in person on Aug 31, 2007, and followed up with details in an E-Mail. The net contribution was correct in the report, but why has the ProKanDo PAC never been required to file an amended return to explain their large transactions?
- The most serious problem in a PAC report, in my opinion, over the past few years is the \$71,332 paid in 33 payments from a fundraising company to a Kansas PAC. Why is the ProKanDo PAC allowed to use a fundraising company, Hudson Bay Company of Illinois (from Minnesota), for solicitations, and then report the contributions as being from the fundraising company instead of the original donors?
- Why are some out-of-state PACs, like the Heavy Constructors from Kansas City, MO, allowed to file "verified statements" and be ignored on the Ethics Commission's web site, and in their reports? The Heavy Constructors spent \$198,300 in the 2005-2006 election cycle, but to view their reports, one must look through mail tubs in the Secretary of State's Office.

- Why are PACs allowed to start with non-zero balances? The Democratic Party Chairs PAC started with \$2908 in 2006. The ProKanDo PAC started with \$14,935 in 2002.
- The Wichita Voters for Truth PAC was administratively closed in Jan 2007 with a balance of \$860. Why hasn't this PAC been required to file a final report with details of their expenditures on negative mailings against a Wichita State Rep candidate?
- Why do we allow the four duly elected congressional district party treasurers to be disenfranchised in their oversight of party money in their congressional district by the duly elected state party treasurer? Why is the state party treasurer allowed to be the treasurer of FIVE separate party committees at the same time? This arrangement allowed a Los Angeles housewife to write six checks on one date that totaled \$35,000 to the Kansas Democratic Party. There are a dozen or more similar examples of huge contributions from a contributor writing multiple checks on a single date to groups controlled by the same treasurer.
- I believe the "Top 20" PAC list published by the Ethics Commission is flawed and hides the political participation and power of several large PACs. Attached is a report, *Money Rankings of Kansas Political Action Committees*, showing how all PACs in Kansas can be rank-ordered to show relative political money and power more accurately.
- Finally, to counter any criticism that I am picking on a few selected PACs, attached is a report, *Summary of Contributions and Expenditures of Kansas Political Action Committees*, from the most recent reporting period. I have scrutinized ALL PACs in Kansas in a similar way in this report, and have identified what I believe are Errors and Omissions that should be addressed.

In conclusion, while HB 2408 makes some improvements, more major campaign finance reforms are needed in Kansas to improve the integrity of Kansas elections.

Unknown Kansas Non-Profits Participating in Kansas Elections in Nov 2006

Progress Kansas "non-profit"

- Incorporator was Jeffrey Stowell, Lawrence, on June 27, 2006.
- As many as six state representative races were affected by as many as three negative mailings by a Kansas non-profit, Progress Kansas.
- Used multiple addresses: one for articles of incorporation (Lawrence) and another for negative mailings (UPS Store box in Olathe).
- The first clue of the group's existence was in the report filed by the Greater Kansas City Chamber PAC with the Missouri Ethics Commission on Oct 18, 2006. Their contribution was missing a Kansas address, however.
- Only two Missouri PACs [the Greater Kansas City Chamber of Commerce PAC, and the Greater Kansas City Women's Political Caucus PAC] and one Kansas PAC [KNEA PAC] knew anything about the Kansas non-profit, Progress Kansas. These three PACs sent a total of \$46,775 to this non-profit.
- Progress Kansas sent out three negative mailings in the week before the Nov 2006 election. The first mailing from Progress Kansas was seen about Nov 3, 2006, just days before the Nov 7 election.
- The Kansas Secretary of State's web site now shows this corporation has gone out of existence: "Status: Forfeited - Failed to Timely File" and its address changed to 123 W 8th Street, Suite 210, Lawrence 66044. This non-profit only existed long enough to send negative mailings against targeted State Reps in the week before the Nov 2006 elections.
- Never filed an IRS 8872 as a 501(c)4, or an IRS 990 as a non-profit.
- As late as Dec 2007 the IRS refused to admit this group existed or admit what, if any, non-profit status "Progress Kansas" ever had.

Therefore, I cannot comment on what action, if any, we are taking or may take in the future concerning the information your provided about these two organizations.” Steven Grodnitzky, Manager, IRS Exempt Organizations

Is the privacy of these groups more important than integrity of Kansas elections?

Kansans for Consumer Privacy Protection “non-profit”

- Incorporator was Jeffrey Stowell, Lawrence, on Aug 28, 2006.
- The Board of Directors of the non-profit was the same as the Chair and Treasurer of the ProKanDo PAC, according to the articles of incorporation filed with the Kansas Secretary of State
- The group sent as many as six “Snoop Dog” mailings that affected the Attorney General’s race in the two weeks before an election. The first known Snoop Dog mailing appeared about Oct 23, 2006 – two weeks and one day before Nov 7, 2006 election.
- “Snoop Dog” phone calls were reported on Oct 30, 2006 in addition to mailings.
- The Oct 30, 2006 ProKanDo report to KS Ethics Commission revealed three ProKanDo expenditures for “Member Dues” as contributions to Kansans for Consumer Privacy Protection. The ProKanDo contributions totaled \$95,700.
- The Jan 10, 2007 ProKanDo report to KS Ethics Commission revealed ProKanDo PAC received a \$34,000 contribution from non-profit Kansans for Consumer Privacy Protection. How is this legal?
- The ProKanDo PAC spent \$145,000 with Stone’s Phones, Palm Spring, CA, who was given a “Pollie Award” for best “negative contrast” phone call. Can a PAC share the marketing theme as a non-profit involved in “advocacy” in the same election?
- This group raised at least \$400,000 according to a *Topeka Capital-Journal* article: http://cjonline.com/stories/062307/sta_179509962.shtml
- Never filed an IRS 8872 as a 501(c)4, or an IRS 990 as a non-profit.
- As late as Dec 2007 the IRS refused to admit this group existed or admit what, if any, non-profit status “Kansans for Consumer Privacy Protection” ever had.

Campaign Finance Reform Suggestions:

- *Require all Kansas PACs to list any affiliated Kansas non-profit, IRS 501(c)3 non-profit, or IRS 501(c)4 non-profit on their Statement of Organization. Define “affiliated” as having any money interest, or shared members of the board of directors, or corporate officers.*
- *Prohibit Kansas PACs from contributing to non-profits that do not have any known IRS non-profit status, e.g., 501(c)3, 501(c)4, or 527 PAC.*
- *Prohibit Kansas non-profits with unknown IRS non-profit status from contributing to PACs.*
- *Prohibit “educational” advocacy political mailings/ads in the two-weeks before an election from any group without known IRS non-profit status. Such groups must file PAC reports if they do not have a known IRS non-profit status.*

Problems with Errors and Omission Reports for PACs

Missing occupations on contributions more than \$150; missing purpose on expenditures.

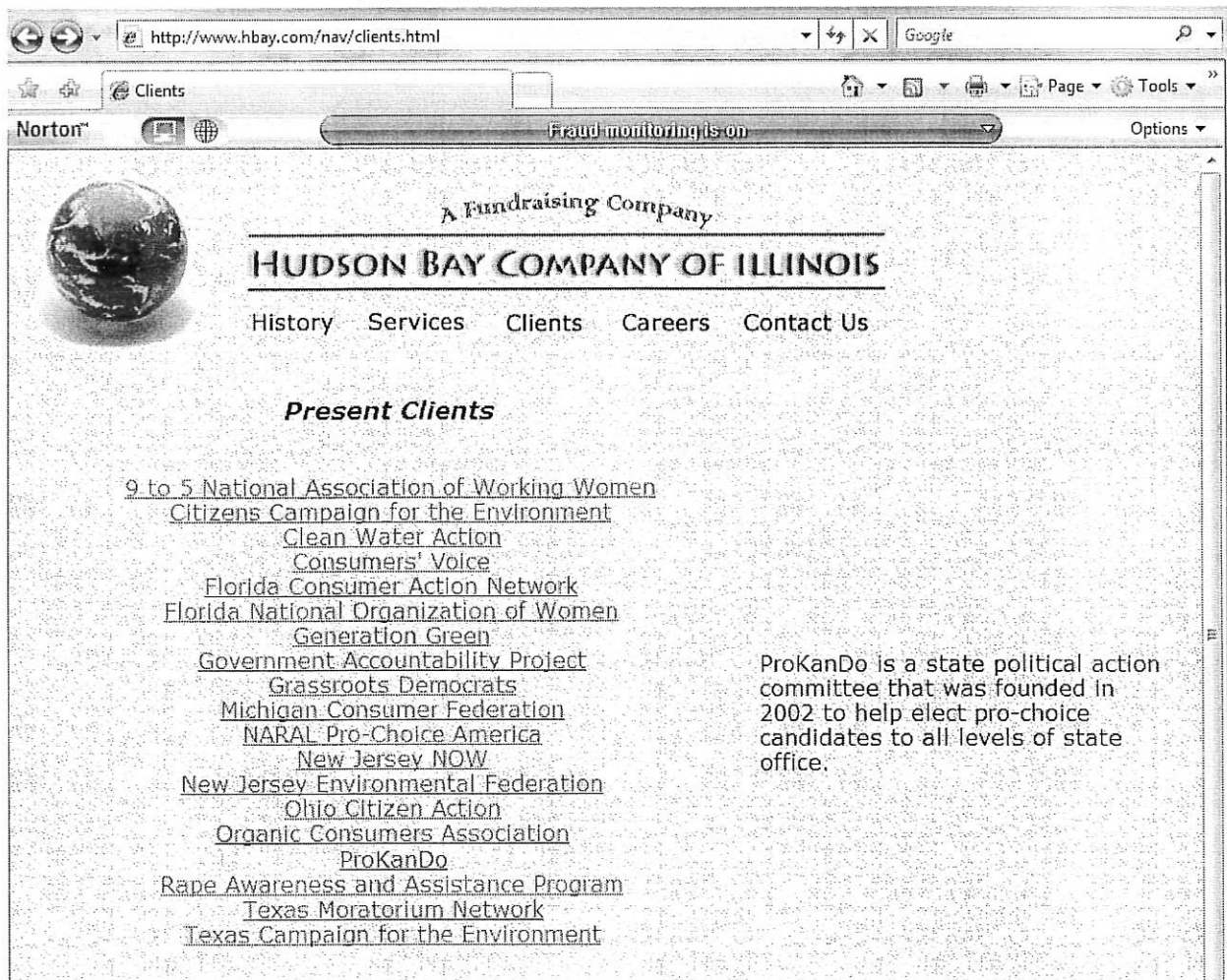



This PAC was incorrectly administratively terminated when mail was returned from the above address, which was the address of Mail Drop Plus that went out of business.

The PAC mailed out a negative flyer against Jan Beemer for State Rep, which carried the notice "Paid for by Wichita Voters for Truth". The Chair and Treasurer of the PAC was one of four contributors with another address, and this alternative address of the Chair had been valid apparently since 1998.

Restrict An Individual to be the PAC/Party Treasurer of ONLY ONE PAC/Party Committee

The Kansas Democratic Party's duly elected treasurer serves as the treasurer for the state party and all FOUR congressional district party committees. The duly elected congressional district party treasurers serve as PAC treasurers instead of party treasurers. This allows one treasurer of all five groups to solicit five different checks at a time from an individual or group. Having a single treasurer helps bypass party contribution limits for a single group, and disenfranchises the elected congressional district party treasurers.

Example:

Pamela M Mullin, "Homemaker" from Los Angeles, CA wrote SIX checks on Sept 8, 2006. These checks were all received and processed by one person.

- 1: \$5,000 1st District - Democratic Legislative Victory Fund
- 2: \$5,000 2nd District - Democratic Legislative Victory Fund
- 3: \$5,000 3rd District - Democratic Legislative Victory Fund
- 4: \$5,000 4nd District – Democratic Tallgrass Committee
- K: \$5,000 Kansas Democratic Party
- K: \$10,000 Kansas Democratic Party

As many as 15 other individuals and groups wrote three-to-six checks in a similar way, with many groups of checks written on one date.

There are several problems with this 2006 "Top 20" PAC ranking report, including:

- The **Heavy Constructors' PAC**, Kansas City, MO, gave \$45,000 to candidates and should have been listed as the #15 Kansas PAC in the above chart. But, since this group files "verified statements" instead of a PAC report, the group was not included in the above analysis. The Heavy Constructors' \$45,000 in contributions to statewide political candidates underestimates their overall political power reflected by their spending of \$198,300.
- **Kansas for Lifesaving Cures** was ranked #7 with \$72,837 in contribution to candidates, but that figure hides their \$418,543 in total expenditures, including \$259,348 on mailings and \$24,859 on phone calls likely for Paul Morrison and Kathleen Sebelius.
- **Kansas Alliance for Education PAC** spent \$5500 on candidates and was not ranked, but had \$182,104 in total expenditures.
- **Kansas Traditional Republican Majority (KTRM) PAC** spent \$2700 on candidates and was not ranked, but had \$157,650 in total expenditures.
- **ProKanDo PAC** spent \$2700 on candidates and was not ranked, but had \$651,200 in monetary expenditures and \$163,260 in in-kind contributions. ProKanDo's had \$814,460 (\$651,200 + \$163,260) in political expenditures, yet didn't make the "Top 20" list.
- The **KNEA PAC** was the #1 PAC spending \$228,300 but what about their other \$107,244 in spending? KNEA PAC spent \$335,544 in 2006 and another \$86,484 in 2005. KNEA's total spending in the 2005-2006 cycle was \$422,028

Occupation not given for 68 contributors giving \$33,650 (an average of almost \$500). [Required to report if contribution more than \$150]. In addition to Stanleys (mentioned above), occupation is missing for Jack Ranson, a former ProKanDo contributor, who gave \$1000 and who worked with ProKanDo on their related PAC, Kansans for a Moderate Government, in 2004 to oppose certain State Senators. ProKanDo knows who Jack Ranson is.

Missing addresses: 14 contributions show no address.

Contribution Address mysteries: \$5331 Reimbursement from Kansans for Consumer Privacy Protection was from home address of Julie Burkhart; \$67 Reimbursement from Julie Burkhart but was from the home address of John and Cheryl Carmichael (connected to Wichita Voters for Truth PAC in 2006); \$100 Reimbursement from Kansas Equality Coalition from the home address of Julie Burkhart; \$100 Reimbursement from Julie Burkhart with no address

Major Expenditures: \$18,766, David Wallack/Balboa Development Advisors, Carlsbad, CA; \$16,590, The Kainber Company, Olympia, WA; \$8000, MSHC Partners Inc, Washington, DC; \$7200, Direct Mail Printers, Wichita; \$5793, Meyer Associates, Teleservices, St. Cloud, MN; \$5000, Keeshan & Associates, Topeka

Notes:

- The data shown here were from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission's web page "Last Updated: March 10, 2008".
- S/O is "Statement of Organization." A PAC's affiliation given in this statement is shown in comments (when the name differs from PAC).
- Comments include "Large Contributors" (generally ≥ \$5000, or sole contributor) and "Large Expenditures" (generally ≥ \$5000), unitemized contributions ≥ \$500, and most contributions where the contributor was unknown.
- Dollar figures were truncated. (Cents were simply ignored and not rounded.)
- What's missing? Some out-of-state PACs can file "verified statements" instead of a PAC report. Those reports are stored in mail tubs in the Kansas Secretary of State's Office, and no information about those PACs is online. For example, one out-of-state PAC, the Heavy Constructors PAC from Kansas City, MO gives considerable money to Kansas political committees, but is never shown in lists of Kansas PACs.
